The number of civil summonses issued for debt

The total number of civil summonses issued for debt decreased by 14,5% in the three months ended August 2024 compared with the three months ended August 2023.

The largest contributors to the 14,5% decrease in civil summonses issued were:

- services (contributing -4,0 percentage points);
- promissory notes (contributing -3,9 percentage points); and
- money lent (contributing -3,7 percentage points) see Table 5.

The number of civil judgements recorded for debt

The total number of civil judgements recorded for debt decreased by 10,8% in the three months ended August 2024 compared with the three months ended August 2023.

The largest negative contributors to the 10,8% decrease were civil judgements relating to:

- services (contributing -4,7 percentage points);
- 'other' debts (contributing -2,2 percentage points); and
- promissory notes (contributing -1,9 percentage points).

Rent (contributing 0,5 of a percentage point) was the only positive contributor – see Table 5.

The value of civil judgements recorded for debt

The total value of civil judgements recorded for debt decreased by 6,9% in the three months ended August 2024 compared with the three months ended August 2023.

The largest negative contributors to the 6,9% decrease were:

- money lent (contributing -5,1 percentage points);
- promissory notes (contributing -2,2 percentage points); and
- goods sold (contributing -1,2 percentage points).

Rent (contributing 1,9 percentage points) was the only positive contributor – see Table 5.

In August 2024, 11 151 civil judgements for debt amounting to R316,5 million were recorded. The largest contributors to the total value of judgements were:

- money lent (R79,7 million or 25,2%);
- services (R72,2 million or 22,8%);
- 'other' debts (R69,9 million or 22,1%); and
- rent (R40,7 million or 12,9%) see Table 2 and Table 3.

Figure 1 - Civil summonses issued for debt





Figure 2 – Civil judgements recorded for debt

Explanatory notes

1

Introduction

- Statistics South Africa (Stats SA) conducts a monthly survey of civil cases recorded and civil summonses for debt issued in South Africa. This information is obtained from selected magistrates' offices.
- **2** Except for cases recorded, all other information relates to debt cases only, therefore claims for damages, ejectment orders and other non-debt cases are excluded.

Purpose of the survey

3 The survey of civil cases for debt covers selected magistrates' offices in South Africa. This survey collects information regarding civil cases recorded, civil summonses issued and civil judgements recorded in order to provide users with information on the extent of unpaid debt in South Africa. The results of the survey are used by the private and public sectors as an indicator of economic performance.

Scope of the survey

4 This survey covers:

- number of civil cases recorded;
- number of civil summonses issued for debt;
- number of civil judgements recorded for debt; and
- · value of civil judgements recorded for debt.

Statistical unit

5 The statistical unit for collection of information is a magistrate's office. Magistrates' offices include the small claims courts.

The largest magistrates' offices in South Africa are included in the monthly survey of civil cases for debt. The monthly survey of 203 magistrates' courts represents approximately 98% of all cases in South Africa.

Survey methodology and design

6 The survey is conducted by email, fax and telephone each month from 203 magistrates' offices.

Collection rate

7 The preliminary collection rate for the civil cases for debt survey for August 2024 was 75,9%. The revised collection rate for July 2024 was 81,6%.

Revised figures

Revised figures are mainly due to late submission of data to Stats SA, or respondents reporting revisions or corrections to their figures. The reasons for routine revisions are outlined in the following schedule. Any unscheduled revisions will be promptly indicated in relevant tables to maintain transparency and accuracy.

Seasonally adjusted estimates of all categories are generated each month, using the X-12 Seasonal Adjustment Program developed by the United States Census Bureau. Seasonal adjustment is a means of removing the estimated effects of normal seasonal variation from the series so that the effects of other influences on the series can be more clearly recognised. Seasonal adjustment does not aim to remove irregular or non-seasonal influences, which may be present in any particular month. Influences that are volatile or unsystematic can still make it difficult to interpret the movement of the series even after adjustment for seasonal variations. Therefore, the month-to-month movements of seasonally adjusted estimates may not be reliable indicators of trend behaviour. Trend cycle

11 The trend is the long-term pattern or movement of a time series. The X-12-ARIMA Seasonal Adjustment Program is used for smoothing seasonally adjusted estimates to estimate the underlying trend cycle.

12 In some cases, Stats SA can also make available statistics which are not published.

Glossary

Acknowledgement of debt

Acknowledgement of debt is a statement by a person/debtor in which he admits that

he owes money to an individual or a company or a bank.

Bills Bills are statements of charges for services rendered or for amounts owed.

Cases recorded Includes civil debt and non-debt cases recorded.

Civil judgements Civil judgements are decisions taken in a civil matter or a dispute between two people

or parties.

Civil summonses Civil summonses are notices to appear before the court of law where a dispute

between two parties or people has to be heard, i.e. not for a criminal offence.

Consent judgements Consent judgements refer to where a debtor agrees to subject himself/herself to obey

or accept a judgement of a court against him for debt he owes without defending the

action.

Default judgements Default judgements refer to where the court gives a judgement or a ruling against the

> defendant who is not present in court and was previously given a notice that was ignored, i.e. a judgement was given against a party or an individual while not present

in court.

Instalment sale transaction

Instalment sale transaction relates to where a person buys goods on credit and pays

for them in instalments, e.g. every week or month, until he/she settles the debt.

Litigants Litigants are people who take part in court proceedings, usually against each other,

like a debtor and a creditor.

Litigants referred Litigants referred relates to a case where the parties have been referred to another

instance/court.

Open account

Open account transactions are revolving credit, i.e. where an account does not have transaction

a final payment date and a person can always take more goods and keep paying as

long as he has credit.

Other services Other services refer to municipal services (except outstanding assessment rates),

plumbers, builders, mechanics, panel beaters and electricians.

Other debts Other debts refer to all other kinds of outstanding debt such as salaries and wages,

medical fund debt, sponsored debt, class and tuition debt, tax, assessment rates and

property levies.

Plaintiff Plaintiff is a person/party in a civil case who asks the court for judgement against

another person.

Professional services Professional services refer to medical doctors, dentists, advocates, attorneys,

auditors, accountants, architects, engineers, hospital services, etc.

Promissory note Promissory note is a written undertaking, signed by a person or party, to pay money

to another person or to the bearer of such a note on a specific date or on demand.

Reference month Reference month refers to one calendar month.

Refer to drawer (R/D) cheques

R/D cheques refer to dishonoured cheques. The drawer is the owner of the cheque. When a person issues a cheque and there is no money in the cheque account, the bank will refuse to pay the bearer. The cheque will be referred back to the drawer.

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
