DEBT CASES CONTINUE TO INCREASE

The total number of civil summonses and the number of civil judgements for debt continue to show an upward trend. The total number of civil summonses for debt, during the three months up to October 1997, increased by 3,2% after seasonal adjustment compared with the previous three months. The total number of civil judgements for debt increased by 5,9% after seasonal adjustment during the same period.

The increase of 3,2% in civil summonses for debt can be attributed to more civil summonses issued in respect of goods sold on open account (+4,3%); 'other services' (+4,0%) and money lent (+4,5%). Out of a total of 137 590 civil summonses for debt issued during October 1997, 30,0% was for summonses pertaining to 'other services', while 16,7% was for civil summonses in respect of goods sold on open account. The major magisterial offices which reported the largest increases in the number of civil cases from September to October 1997 are the Cape Peninsula (+44,8%); Durban (+22,1%); Johannesburg (+46,3%) and Pretoria (+34,5%).

During October 1997, 74 292 civil judgements for debt were passed, and the amount involved was R503,5 million (see Table 3). The largest portion was in respect of money lent (R202,3 million), followed by promissory notes, bills, R/D cheques, credit cards and other acknowledgments of debt (R51,0 million), and goods sold on open account (R44,4 million). It is worth noting that the average amount per judgement (regarding all civil judgements for debt) decreased from R6 875 for October 1996 to R6 777 for October 1997. The average amount per judgement for cases relating to money lent decreased quite substantially (-24,0%) over the same period, from R18 298 to R13 910 whereas that concerning promissory notes, increased from R6 797 million to R9 214 million (+35,6%) during the same period.

Default and consent judgements relate to judgements given in respect of undefended debt cases only.


COMPARABILITY

The jurisdiction limit for civil cases handled by Magistrate's Offices (R20 000 for liquid assets and R50 000 for non liquid assets) was increased to R100 000 as from 1 May 1995. A comparison with the period prior to May 1995 must thus be handled with circumspection.

Statistics in respect of small claims courts are updated annually.


CIVIL SUMMONSES ISSUED - NUMBER

SMALL CLAIMS COURTS

NOTES

Small claims courts serve as a forum for the adjudication of money claims against individuals or firms. It is for use by the general public only and not for business enterprises.

Up to 30 September 1995 the following actions were excluded from the jurisdiction of small claims courts:

- Claims exceeding R2 000 in value;
- Claims against the state;
- Claims based on cession or the transfer of rights;
- Claims for damages in respect of defamation, malicious prosecution, wrongful imprisonment, wrongful arrest, seduction and breach of promise to marry;
- Claims for the dissolution of a marriage;
- Claims concerning the validity of a will;
- Claims concerning the status of a person in respect of his mental capacity; and
- Claims in which the performance in accordance with a contract is sought, without an alternative claim for payment of damages, except in the case of a claim for rendering an account or transferring movable or immovable property not exceeding R2 000 in value.

As from 1 October 1995 the jurisdiction limit of R2 000 was raised to R3 000.

COMPARABILITY

The information in respect of magistrates courts shown in this statistical release refers to debt cases only and is therefore not strictly comparable with the information shown for the small claims courts.

CONCEPTS

"Courts" relate to the total number of small claims courts at the end of the months as indicated. "Litigants referred" relates to the number of persons (plaintiffs) referred to legal assistants by clerks of the small claims court.
