Key findings as at the end of December 2002 regarding the number of liquidations

Total number of liquidations lower than a year ago

The total number of liquidations recorded for the year 2002 decreased by 7,2% (from 4 156 to 3 855) compared with the corresponding period of 2001. The total number of liquidations recorded for December 2002 decreased by 43,2% (from 273 to 155) compared with December 2001. The total number of liquidations recorded for the fourth quarter of 2002 decreased by 27,5% (from 1 024 to 742) compared with the third quarter of 2002.

The decrease of 7,2% in the total number of liquidations during the year 2002 compared with the year 2001 was due to a decrease of 37,3% (from 1 284 to 805) in compulsory liquidations. Compulsory liquidations of close corporations and of companies decreased by 42,2% (from 841 to 486) and 25,7% (from 443 to 329) respectively during the above-mentioned period.

The decrease of 43,2% in the total number of liquidations during December 2002 compared with December 2001 was due to a decrease of 64,8% (from 71 to 25) in both compulsory and 35,6% (from 202 to 130) voluntary liquidations.

Key findings as at the end of November 2002

Total number of insolvencies decreases

The total number of insolvencies recorded for the three months ended November 2002 decreased by 39,3% (from 621 to 377) compared with the previous three months. The total number of insolvencies recorded for the first eleven months of 2002 decreased by 39,2% (from 3 605 to 2 192) compared with the first eleven months of 2001. Furthermore, the total number of insolvencies for November 2002 decreased by 64,8% (from 310 to 109) compared with November 2001.

Purpose of the survey

The Survey of Liquidations and Insolvencies is a monthly survey covering all liquidations and insolvencies in South Africa (SA). Information on liquidations is obtained from the Registrar of Companies and Close Corporations, Department of Trade and Industry, while information on insolvencies is based on Notices of the Master of the Supreme Court which appears in the Government Gazette. The results of this survey are used by the private and public sectors to measure economic performance and are also an important indicator of the scope of unpaid debt in South Africa.

- Introduction**
- 1 Statistics South Africa (Stats SA) collects administrative information on liquidations from the Registrar of Companies and Close Corporations, Department of Trade and Industry, while information on insolvencies is gathered from Notices of the Master of the Supreme Court which appear in the Government Gazette.
- 2 This statistical release reflects voluntary and compulsory liquidations of companies and close corporations and insolvencies of individuals and partnerships.

- the total number of companies and close corporations which were liquidated; and
 - the total number of individuals and partnerships placed under final sequestration.

Glossary

- Compulsory liquidation**
- A compulsory liquidation takes place when the affairs of a company or close corporation are wound up by order of the court.
- Insolvency**
- An insolvency refers to an individual or partnership which is unable to pay its debt and is placed under final sequestration. The number of insolvencies does not refer to the number of persons involved, as a partnership which is unable to pay its debt is regarded as one insolvency, irrespective of the number of partners.
- Liquidation**
- A liquidation refers to the winding-up of the affairs of a company or close corporation when liabilities exceed assets and it can be resolved by voluntarily action or by an order of the court.
- Voluntary liquidation**
- A voluntary liquidation takes place when a company or close corporation, by own choice, resolves to wind-up its affairs.
