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INFLATION RATE DECREASES FOR THE FIRST TIME IN ELEVEN MONTHS

The official inflation rate, i.e. the annual rate of change in the Consumer Price Index, is 9,6% for March 1997. This rate is 0,2 of a percentage point lower than the corresponding rate of 9,8% for February 1997. The monthly increase (i.e. February 1997 to March 1997) in the Consumer Price Index is 0,6%, while the seasonally adjusted index shows an increase of 0,7% for the same period.

An alternative expression of the change in the CPI is to annualise the percentage change between the average index of the three months up to March 1997 and the average of the previous three months. This approach, when using seasonally adjusted data, shows an increase of 9,5%, while unadjusted data shows a 10,9% increase.

CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE MONTHLY INCREASE OF 0,6%

The monthly increase of 0,6% can be attributed to increases in the price indices for food (contributing +0,1 of a percentage point), housing (contributing +0,1 of a percentage point), education (contributing +0,2 of a percentage point, due to the annual price surveys for university and school fees), and "other" items (contributing +0,2 of a percentage point).

FOOD PRICES

The price index for food shows an annual rate of increase of 9,8% at March 1997. This rate is 0,2 of a percentage point lower than the corresponding rate of 10,0% at February 1997.

From February 1997 to March 1997 food prices increased by 0,6%. This increase was caused by monthly increases in the price indices for grain products (+0,7%), fish and other seafood (+0,4%), milk, cheese and eggs (+1,0%), fats and oils (+1,2%), fruit and nuts (+1,6%), vegetables (+1,8%), sugar (+0,2%), coffee, tea and cocoa (+0,6%) and "other" food items (+0,4%). These increases were slightly counteracted by a decrease in the price index for meat (-0,4%).

PRICE INDEX FOR NON-FOOD ITEMS SHOWS A MONTHLY INCREASE OF 0,6%

The monthly increase of 0,6% in the price index for all items excluding food resulted from monthly increases in the price indices for non-alcoholic beverages (+1,4%), alcoholic beverages (+2,3%), cigarettes, cigars and tobacco (+3,4%), clothing and footwear (+0,3%), housing (+0,3%), fuel and power (+0,1%), furniture and equipment (+0,6%), household operation (+1,0%), medical care and health expenses (+0,5%), transport (+0,1%, due to an increase of 1,6% in the index for vehicles, which was counteracted by a decrease of 1,1% in the index for running cost, mainly due to decreases in the prices of petrol and diesel), recreation and entertainment (+0,6%), education (+9,6%), personal care (+0,4%) and "other" items (+0,3%).

METROPOLITAN AND OTHER URBAN AREA INDICES

The inflation rate for "metropolitan and other urban areas" will not yet be computable before January 1998, when the data for the previous twelve months will be available for comparison.

METROPOLITAN AREA INDICES

The highest inflation rate of 10,7% was recorded for Bloemfontein, while the lowest inflation rate of 7,6% was recorded for the Free State Goldfields.

Regarding food, the highest annual increase of 13,3% was recorded for Durban/Pinetown, while the lowest annual rate of 5,9% was recorded for the Free State Goldfields.

INFLATION RATE FOR PENSIONERS

The inflation rate for pensioners is 9,6% at March 1997. The highest rate of increase of 10,4% was recorded for the Cape Peninsula and Bloemfontein, while the lowest rate of increase of 6,9% was recorded for the Free State Goldfields.

FOOD INFLATION AS MEASURED AT CHAIN-STORES AND OTHER RETAILERS

Food prices at chain-stores show an annual rate of increase of 8,8% at March 1997, while food prices at other retailers show an annual rate of increase of 8,1%. From February 1997 to March 1997, food prices at chain-stores decreased by 0,4%, while food prices at other retailers increased by 0,7%.

CPI FOR APRIL 1997

In addition to the normal price surveys for April 1997, it has come to the attention of the CSS that changed prices apply with effect from the first week of April 1997 with regard to certain urban areas' water tarriffs, toll fees, medicines, newspapers and magazines and home owner's insurance.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. All price information refers to the first seven days of the reference month.
2. By the phrase "each area compared with itself", the CSS reminds the user that the consumer price indices relating to various metropolitan and other urban areas as shown in Table 4 and Table 6 do not permit inter-urban comparison of price levels or living costs. The indices do not indicate whether it is more expensive to live in one city than in another. The indices indicate for each urban area, independently of any of the other urban areas, the price changes which have taken place from time to time.
3. The indices for all items excluding food, Table 4.4, have been calculated for each area separately as from July 1994. These indices are calculated by means of the index for all items and the index for food of each area.
4. Value Added Tax (VAT) is included in general in the prices of all items on which VAT is applicable.
5. The five expenditure group categories or quintiles were defined according to total expenditure per household as in October 1995 as:

Very low expenditure group - up to R6 340

Low expenditure group - R6 341 up to R11 590

Middle expenditure group - R11 591 up to R21 909

High expenditure group - R21 910 up to R49 498

Very high expenditure group - R49 499 and more

6. A more detailed set of weights for the metropolitan and other urban areas in total according to the new 1995-weighting structure of the CPI, as well as that for the core basket were published in Statistical release P0141.5 of 27 March 1997.
