## Production Price Index July 1997

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## PRODUCER INFLATION AT 6,9% THE LOWEST IN TWELVE MONTHS

*The Production Price Index (PPI) for all commodities for South African consumption shows an annual rate of increase of 6,9% at July 1997, i.e. for the period July 1996 to July 1997. This rate is 0,6 of a percentage point lower than the annual rate of increase of 7,5% at June 1997 and is also the lowest since July 1996, when it was 6,6%. The monthly increase in this index (i.e. June 1997 to July 1997) is 0,2%, compared to a decrease of 0,2% for June 1997. The seasonally adjusted index increased by 0,1% from June 1997 to July 1997.*

## LOWER ANNUAL PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN THE PPI FOR LOCALLY PRODUCED COMMODITIES

The annual rate of increase in the PPI for locally produced commodities is 7,5% at July 1997. This rate is 1,0 percentage point lower than the corresponding annual rate of 8,5% at June 1997. From June 1997 to July 1997 this index increased by 0,2%, while the seasonally adjusted index remained unchanged.

## ANNUAL RATE OF INCREASE IN THE PPI FOR IMPORTED COMMODITIES THE LOWEST IN 15 MONTHS

The PPI for imported commodities reflects an annual increase of 3,9% at July 1997. This rate is 0,2 of a percentage point lower than the corresponding annual rate of 4,1% at June 1997, and is the lowest rate since April 1996, when it was 3,2%. From June 1997 to July 1997 this index decreased by 0,2%, while the seasonally adjusted index remained unchanged during the same period.

## MONTHLY CHANGES IN THE PPI FOR ALL COMMODITIES FOR SOUTH AFRICAN CONSUMPTION

Monthly increases occurred in the price indices for fishing (+2,8%), food at manufacturing (+0,2%), tobacco products (+1,1%), textiles and made-up goods (+0,1%), leather and leather products (+0,2%), footwear (+0,3%), wood and wood products (+0,3%), chemicals and chemical products (+0,2%), rubber and plastic products (+2,1%), medical, precision and optical instruments (+0,4%), electricity (+3,3%) and gas and water (+12,6%). In contrast, there were monthly decreases in the price indices for agricultural products (-0,6%), mining and quarrying products (-1,2%), beverages (-0,1%), paper, paper products and printing (-0,3%) and products of petroleum and coal (-2,2%).

## MONTHLY CHANGES IN THE PPI FOR IMPORTED COMMODITIES

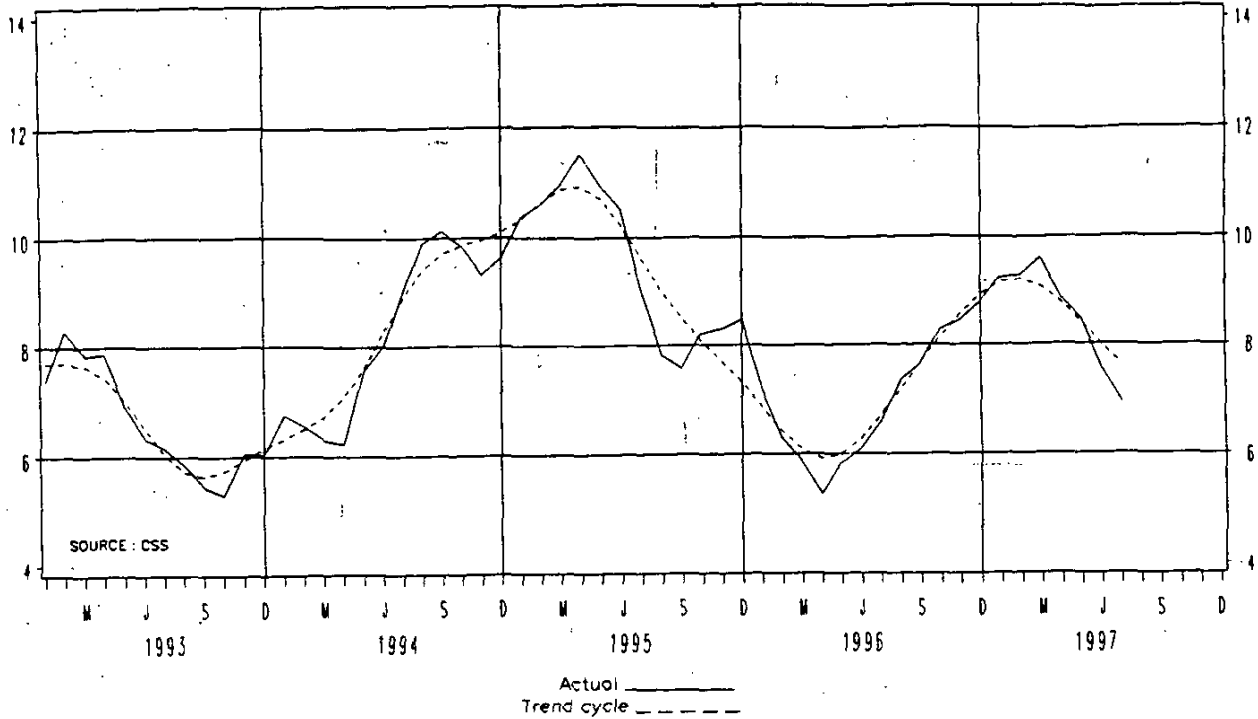
Monthly increases were recorded in the import prices of agricultural non-food products (+0,7%), food at manufacturing (+2,2%) and textiles and made-up goods (+0,5%). In contrast, monthly decreases were reported in the import prices of agricultural food products (-8,8%), mining and quarrying products (-1,3%) and chemicals and chemical products (-0,1%). The actual crude petroleum information for July 1997 received from Customs and Excise, reflects a price decrease of 10,8% compared with the price information for May 1997.

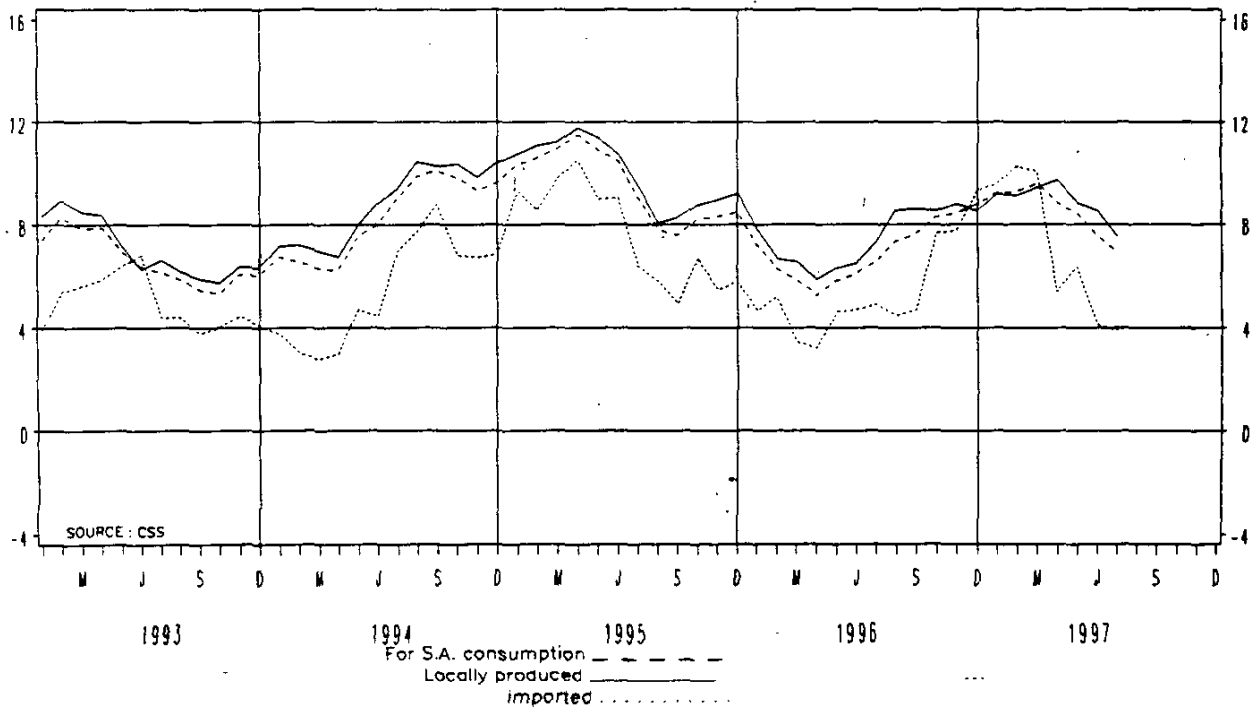
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PRODUCTION PRICE INDEX

**2. PRICING BASIS**

All indices are based on producer prices at the point of production in the case of commodities produced in South Africa, and wholesale prices "ex-warehouse", in the case of imported commodities. Prices "delivered" or "free on rail" are accepted if this is the normal basis of quotation. Price information refers to the first seven days of the relevant month, except in the case of mining and most of the agriculture products, where it refers to the average price for the month. General sales tax is excluded but can be accounted for by multiplying a particular index by 1,04 prior to March 1982; 1,05 from March 1982; 1,06 from September 1982; 1,07 from February 1984; 1,10 from July 1984; 1,12 from April 1985; and 1,13 from April 1989. Value added tax can be added by multiplying the relevant index by 1,10 from October 1991; and by 1,14 from April 1993.

**Average price of imported crude petroleum**

The average price of imported crude petroleum, used in the compilation of the import component of the PPI, is calculated as the value (in rands) divided by the quantity of imported crude for the relevant month.
