ANNUAL RATE OF INCREASE IN THE PPI FOR NOVEMBER 1996 HIGHER AT 8,5%

The Production Price Index (PPI) for all commodities for South African consumption shows an annual rate of increase of 8,5% at November 1996, i.e. for the period November 1995 to November 1996. This rate is 0,2 of a percentage point higher than the annual rate of increase of 8,3% at October 1996.

The monthly increase in this index during the period October 1996 to November 1996 is 0,5%, and 0,8% in the seasonally adjusted index.

HIGHER ANNUAL PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN THE PPI FOR LOCALLY PRODUCED COMMODITIES

The annual rate of increase in the PPI for locally produced commodities is 8,8% at November 1996. This is 0,3 of a percentage point higher than the corresponding annual rate of 8,5% at October 1996. The monthly increase, i.e. from October 1996 to November 1996 in this index is 0,5%, while the seasonally adjusted index increased by 0,9% over this period.

ANNUAL RATE OF INCREASE IN THE PPI FOR IMPORTED COMMODITIES SLIGHTLY HIGHER

The PPI for imported commodities reflects an annual rate of increase of 7,8% at November 1996, 0,1 of a percentage point higher than the corresponding annual rate of 7,7% at October 1996. From October 1996 to November 1996 this index increased by only 0,1%, resulting from a monthly increase of 0,8% in the prices of manufactured products (with a weight of 89,88 out of 100) which was partially counteracted by a decrease of 6,6% in the recorded price of crude petroleum (with a weight 6,66 of out of 100). The seasonally adjusted index reflects a monthly increase of 0,5%.

The recorded import price of crude petroleum is supplied to the CSS by Customs and Excise. It reflected a monthly decrease of 6,6%. The average unit price, which increased by 13,01c per litre from 56,12c per litre in September 1996 to the high 69,13c per litre in October 1996, decreased to 64,54c per litre in November 1996. The decrease reflects the fact that several large consignments during the month accounting for nearly half the total quantity of imported crude petroleum for the month, came in at average unit prices appreciably less than the average for the preceding month. The lower unit prices tend to correspond to larger consignments in the period.

MONTHLY CHANGES IN THE PPI FOR ALL COMMODITIES FOR SOUTH AFRICAN CONSUMPTION

Relatively large monthly increases occurred in the indices for other agricultural products (+0,7%), fishing products (+6,5%), food at manufacturing (+1,5%), products of petroleum and coal (+1,8%), non-metallic mineral products (+0,7%), basic metals (+0,9%), metal products (+2,1%), non-electrical machinery and equipment (+1,3%), electrical machinery and apparatus (+0,5%), transport equipment (+1,4%) and furniture (+1,9%). Against these, a relatively large monthly decrease occurred in the index for mining and quarrying products (-1,9%).

MONTHLY CHANGES IN THE PPI FOR IMPORTED COMMODITIES

Monthly increases occurred in the prices of agricultural products (+3,5%), food at manufacturing (+2,8%), textiles and made-up goods (+1,2%), chemicals and chemical products (+0,3%), metal products (+9,4%), non-electrical machinery and equipment (+0,8%) and transport equipment (+3,0%), while the prices of forestry products (+0,0%) remained virtually unchanged. Against these, a decrease occurred in the prices of mining and quarrying products (-5,8%, due to a decrease of 6,6% in the prices of crude petroleum), while the prices of wood and wood products (-0,0%) and paper, paper products and printing (-0,0%) remained virtually unchanged.





2. PRICING BASIS

All indices are based on producer prices at the point of production in the case of commodities produced in South Africa, and wholesale prices "ex-warehouse", in the case of imported commodities. Prices "delivered" or "free on rail" are accepted if this is the normal basis of quotation. Price information refers to the first seven days of the relevant month. General sales tax is excluded but can be accounted for by multiplying a particular index by 1,04 prior to March 1982; 1,05 from March 1982; 1,06 from September 1982; 1,07 from February 1984; 1,10 from July 1984; 1,12 from April 1985; and 1,13 from April 1989. Value added tax can be added by multiplying the relevant index by 1,10 from October 1991; and by 1,14 from April 1993.
