mining and quarrying, manufacturing, construction and electricity

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EMPLOYMENT IN THE FORMAL MINING AND QUARRYING, MANUFACTURING, CONSTRUCTION AND ELECTRICITY BUSINESS SECTORS CONTINUES TO DECREASE

Total employment in the formal mining and quarrying, manufacturing, construction and electricity business sectors showed a decrease of 1,3% or 30 009 employees between November 1997 and December 1997. All four sectors decreased during this period. The highest decrease of 1,7% or 22 719 employees was recorded in the manufacturing sector. This was mainly due to discharges of employees and the closure of some establishments. In this sector, 20 of the 26 subgroups recorded decreases, with 5 of these subgroups, namely transport equipment, furniture, food, clothing and machinery, recording decreases of more than 2,0%. A decrease of 1,0% or 5 064 employees was also recorded in the mining and quarrying sector, followed by the construction and

the electricity sectors with decreases of 0,7% or 2 021 employees and 0,5% or 205 employees, respectively.

The total employment in the above-mentioned sectors for December 1997 reflected a decrease of 5,3% or 123 543 employees compared with December 1996. All four sectors reflected an annual decrease. The mining and quarrying sector showed an annual decrease of 6,6% or 37 145 employees, followed by the manufacturing sector with a decrease of 5,3% or 75 064 employees at December 1997. The construction sector and the electricity sector showed decreases of 3,4% or 10 680 employees and 1,6% or 654 employees respectively for the same period.

Total salaries and wages paid to employees for December 1997 in the mining and quarrying, manufacturing, construction and electricity sectors showed a monthly increase of 9,7% or R747,2 million. This increase was mainly due to bonuses paid by the manufacturing and construction sectors. However, the electricity sector showed a monthly decrease of 25,5% or R23,4 million due to bonuses being paid in November 1997. Seasonally adjusted average monthly salaries and wages at current prices for the above-mentioned sectors showed a decrease of 3,0% or R99 for the December 1997.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. Data in respect of manufacturing, construction and electricity are estimates based on a sample survey. The survey covers private establishments in manufacturing, construction and electricity (including Eskom). Data in respect of manufacturing and construction have been revised to correspond with the 1988 manufacturing and construction census results. Historical data were published in statistical release P0242.2 of 28 October 1993.

2. As from January 1993 the industrial classification of this statistical release is based on the **Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities** (SIC), Fifth edition, January 1993. The major and subgroup classification of this edition of the industrial classification differs in some cases from the classification of the previous edition that was used in this statistical release up to December 1992. The above-mentioned classification is obtainable from the CSS, free of charge.

3. On request of users the release of information on manufacturing was expanded from a major group basis to a subgroup basis. To accommodate this expansion, the sample was enlarged and was implemented as from November 1992. Information on a subgroup basis is published as from January 1993 and is not available for the period prior to January 1993.

4. In the case of some respondents the information on a population group basis cannot be supplied. As from February 1993 this information is shown under the category *Unspecified*.

5. Salaries and wages refer to gross salaries and wages and include *inter alia*, overtime payments, allowances and bonuses. Electricity (including Eskom) pays bonuses in November, while manufacturing

and construction pay bonuses in December.

6. Average salaries and wages at constant 1995 prices are calculated by deflating the average salaries and wages at current prices with the CPI for all expenditure groups (metropolitan).

7. As far as employment is concerned, figures which have not been rounded off are shown, while that in respect of salaries and wages and bonuses are rounded off to the nearest final digit.

8. INCLUSION OF FORMER TBVC STATES

Data on the mining and quarrying sector also include particulars of the former TBVC states as from January 1994. In the case of the manufacturing, construction and electricity sectors data on the former TBVC states are included as from January 1996.

9. To produce timely, accurate, relevant and accessible statistics, the CSS has reviewed all its economic and labour statistics series during 1997. After lengthy discussions with users and respondents, it was decided to replace the monthly surveys in the mining and quarrying, manufacturing, construction and electricity sectors, with quarterly surveys. As a result hereof, this publication will, as from March 1998, be replaced by the statistical release, P0271 - Total Employment and Earnings in the formal non-agricultural business sectors.
