A SLIGHT INCREASE IN EMPLOYMENT IN THE FORMAL COMMERCE AND HOTELS SECTOR

Employment in the formal commerce and hotels sector showed an annual increase of 1,2% or 8 914 employees between September 1996 and September 1997.

Employment in the retail trade and hotels sectors increased by 3,1% (from 394 400 to 406 700 employees) and 1,1% (from 45 512 to 46 026 employees) respectively between September 1996 and September 1997. In contrast, employment in the motor trade sector decreased by 3,2% (3 700 employees) and in the wholesale trade sector by 0,1% (200 employees) for the same period.

Average salaries and wages (at current prices) in the formal commerce and hotels sector increased by 9,4% between September 1996 and September 1997. The hotels and motor trade sectors recorded increases of 14,4% (from R1 628 to R1 862) and 12,8% (from R2 810 to R3 171) respectively for the annual period ended in September 1997. The corresponding figures for the wholesale trade and retail trade sectors are 11,0% (from R3 727 to R4 137) and 6,9% (from R2 302 to R2 461), respectively.

The real average salaries and wages (at constant 1995 prices) increased by 5,3% (from R1 501 to R1 581) in the hotels sector, by 3,9% (from R2 591 to R2 692) in the motor trade sector and by 2,2% (from R3 436 to R3 512) in the wholesale trade sector between September 1996 and September 1997. The only sector which deviated from this pattern of increases in

real average salaries and wages was the retail trade sector which recorded a decrease of 1,6% (from R2 122 to R2 089) for the same period. The commerce and hotels sector in total recorded a marginal increase of 0,7% (from R2 536 to R2 555) between September 1996 and September 1997.

Vacancies in the commerce and hotels sector remained extremely low with only 551 posts available at the end of September 1997.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. The data in respect of wholesale, retail and motor trade and hotels are estimates based on quarterly sample surveys. Data relating to the latest quarter are preliminary.
2. The data in respect of **agricultural marketing boards** are published in the statistical release P0251 - Employment and salaries and wages: Public sector, as from 1987, and are thus not included in this statistical release.
3. Since September 1993 the data of those establishments where personnel records do not allow identification of population groups, are shown as **unspecified**.
4. Data on the **former TBVC states** are included at the hotels sector as from March 1995. Information available to the CSS indicates that the total employment of the hotels sector in these states for March 1995 amounted to approximately 16,0% of the total employment for the total hotels sector.

In the case of the other sectors, data on the **former TBVC states** are included as from March 1996. Information available to the CSS indicates that the total employment of the trade sectors in these states amounted to approximately 0,1% of the total employment for the retail trade sector, 0,1% of the total employment for the wholesale trade sector, and 0,7% of the total employment for the motor trade sector.

5. The data do not include persons liable to military service.

6. EMPLOYMENT

6.1 Employment refers to the number of paid employees on the last pay-day of the quarter.

6.2 Full-time employees (permanent and temporary) refers to the number of employees who normally work 30 hours or more per week.

6.3 Part-time employees:

Workers in morning posts refer to the number of employees who normally work more than 20 hours but less than 30 hours per week.

Other part-time employees refer to the number of persons employed who normally work 20 hours or less per week.

6.4 The number of full-time and part-time employees are converted to full-time equivalent employees.

7. SALARIES AND WAGES AND BONUSES

Salaries and wages and bonuses refer to gross salaries and wages and bonuses for the quarter and include, inter alia, overtime payments, allowances, commission, fringe benefits paid in cash and employers' contributions to pension and other staff funds. Most wholesale and retail trade establishments pay annual and incentive bonuses during December.

8. AVERAGE MONTHLY SALARIES AND WAGES

8.1 The average salaries and wages and bonuses (at current prices) are calculated by dividing the salaries and wages and bonuses by the number of full-time equivalent employees.

8.2 The average salaries and wages and bonuses (at constant 1995 prices) are calculated by deflating the average salaries and wages and bonuses (at current prices) with the CPI for all expenditure groups (metropolitan).

9. VACANCIES

Vacancies refer to the number of additional persons that can be employed immediately on the last pay-day of the quarter.
