EMPLOYMENT RESULTS

9 581 000



There was a quarterly increase of **75 000** jobs (or **0,8%**) in the Q3:2020 compared with Q2:2020.




Jobs decreased by 616 000 (or -6,0%) in the reference quarter compared with the same quarter of 2019 (Q3:2019).







There was an increase in full time employees and part time employees



There was a quarterly **increase** of **47 000** full-time jobs in the Q3:2020 compared with Q2:2020.

Full-time jobs decreased year-onyear by 525 000 in the reference quarter compared with the same quarter of 2019 (i.e. Q3:2019). There was a quarterly **increase** of **28 000** part-time jobs in the Q3:2020 compared with Q2:2020.

Part-time jobs decreased year-onyear by 91 000 in the reference quarter compared with the same quarter of 2019 (i.e. Q3:2019).

All industries recorded losses in employment year-on-year. Most job losses were reported in Business services and Trade industries with 163 000 and 162 000 in Q3:2020 compared with Q3:2019, respectively.

The mining industry reported net decrease of 2 000 in employment in third quarter of 2020.

There was an annual decrease of 13 000 jobs from 463 000 in Q3:2019 to 450 000 in Q3:2020.

Mining and quarrying industry, Q3:2009 to Q3:2020












The trade industry gained 31 000 jobs in the 3rd quarter of 2020 compared to Q2:2020.

Year-on-year the industry lost 162 000 jobs compared with same quarter of 2019.

Trade industry, Q3:2009 to Q3:2020





The community services industry reported a net gain of 26 000 jobs in the third quarter compared to Q2:2020. Year-on-year the industry decreased by 61 000 jobs compared with same quarter of the previous year (i.e. Q3:2019).










The total number of persons employed increased from 9 506 000 in Q2:2020 to 9 581 000 in Q3:2020

Gross Earnings increased by R35,5bn (or 5,5%) to R680bn in Q3:2020

Gross earnings increased by R35,5bn (or 5,5%) in the third quarter of 2020 compared to Q2:2020. Increases in gross earnings were due to increases in both basic salaries/wages and bonuses and overtime payments by R32,9 billion and R2,6 billion respectively.

Year-on-year gross earnings decreased by R43,8 billion (or -6,1%). Decreases were due to basic salary payments made by R31,7 billion and bonus and overtime payments by R12,2 billion.



There was a quarterly increase of 5,5% in the third quarter compared to Q2:2020. Year-on-year decrease of 6,1% in earnings was reported in the current quarter compared with September 2019.

Quarterly and annual percentage change in gross earnings paid in the third quarter of 2020.










Time series of gross earnings paid from Q3:2009 to Q3:2020

AME including bonuses and overtime payments increased in August 2020 to R22 579. This is a 5,3% increase from R21 448 in May 2020.

Quarter-on-quarter and year-on-year AME increased by 5,3% and 0,9% respectively.












All industries reported increases in average monthly earnings in the third quarter compared with Q2:2020. Five of the eight industries increased above industry average of 5,3% quarter-on-quarter.

Year-on-year the electricity industry reported 9,0% increase in AME contrary to Construction industry which declined by 6,9%. Three of the eight industries declined in August 2020 compared to August 2019.

Average monthly earnings were measured at R22 579 in the formal non-agricultural sector of the economy in August 2020.

This is a 5,3% increase when compared to May 2020, and an annual increase of 0,9%.
