QES is an enterprise-based sample survey

QES collects information on employing businesses registered for VAT with annual turnover greater than R300 000

Samples are drawn from private non-agricultural businesses e.g. factories, offices, stores as well as national, provincial and local government entities

Sample size of approximately 20 000 was selected

EMPLOYMENT RESULTS

Number of persons employed in Q1:2021

9 644 000



There was a quarterly decrease of 9 000 jobs (or -0,1%) in the Q1:2021 compared with Q4:2020.



Jobs **decreased** by 552 000 (or -5,4%) in the reference quarter compared with the same quarter of 2020 (Q1:2020).





Full-time jobs decreased quarter-onquarter by 63 000 and year-on-year full-time jobs decreased by 599 000.

Part-time jobs increased quarteron-quarter by 54 000 and year-onyear part-time jobs increased by 47 000.

The mining industry reported net increase of 5 000 jobs in the first quarter of 2021.

Year-on-year the industry increased by 3 000 when comparing Q1:2020 with Q1:2021.

Mining and quarrying industry, Q3:2009 to Q1:2021












The trade industry lost 40 000 jobs in the first quarter of 2021 compared to Q4:2020.

Year-on-year the industry lost 162 000 jobs compared with same quarter of 2020.

Trade industry, Q3:2009 to Q1:2021










The community services industry reported a net gain of 47 000 jobs in the first quarter compared to Q4:2020.

Year-on-year the industry increased by 26 000 jobs compared with same quarter of the previous year (i.e. Q1:2020).










The total number of persons employed decreased from 9 653 000 in Q4:2020 to 9 644 000 in Q1:2021

Number of employees time-series from Q3:2009 to Q1:2021












Gross Earnings decreased by R26,8 billion to R715,3 billion in Q1:2021











Gross earnings decreased by R26,8 billion (or -3,6%) in the first quarter of 2021 compared to Q4:2020. Decreases in gross earnings were due to decreases in both basic salaries/wages and bonuses and overtime payments by R4,1 billion and R22,7 billion respectively.

Year-on-year gross earnings decreased by **R14,1** billion (or **-1,9%**). Decrease was due to basic salary payments made by **R19,6** billion; whilst bonus and overtime payments increased by **R5,5** billion.




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There was a quarterly decrease of 3,6% in gross earnings in the first guarter of 2021 compared to Q4:2020. Year-on-year decrease of 1,9% in earnings was reported in the first quarter of 2021 compared with first quarter of the previous year.

Quarterly and annual percentage change in gross earnings paid in the reference quarter.












Time series of gross earnings paid from Q3:2009 to Q1:2021








Three out of eight industries reported increases in average monthly earnings in the first quarter compared with Q4:2020. All three industries increased above industry average of 0,0% quarter-on-quarter. Year-on-year the Electricity industry reported an increase of 6,6% in AME while the Construction industry declined by -1,4%.
