QES Background

QES is an enterprise-based sample survey

QES collects information on employing businesses registered for VAT with annual turnover greater than R300 000

Samples are drawn from private non-agricultural businesses e.g. factories, offices, stores as well as national, provincial and local government entities

Sample size of approximately 20 000 was selected



EMPLOYMENT RESULTS

Number of persons employed in Q4:2022 9 968 000 up from 9 920 000 in Q3:2022



There was a quarterly increase of 48 000 jobs (or 0,5%) in Q4:2022 compared with Q3:2022.



There was an annual **decrease** of 94 000 (or -0,9%) in fourth quarter of 2022 compared with the same quarter of 2021 (Q4:2021).







There was a quarterly net increase of 48 000 jobs in Q4:2022. Most of the job gains were reported in part-time employment with a net increase of 42 000 and full-time jobs increased by 6 000.

Year-on-year QES reported a net loss of 94 000 jobs in Q4:2022 compared with Q4:2021. Part-time and full time jobs decreased by 85 000 and 9 000 respectively.








The mining industry reported net increase of 2 000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2022.

Year-on-year the industry increased by 13 000 when comparing Q4:2022 with Q4:2021.








The trade industry reported net gain of 49 000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2022 compared to Q3:2022.

Year-on-year the industry added 42 000 jobs compared with same quarter of 2021.

The community services industry reported no change in the fourth quarter of 2022 compared to previous quarter (i.e. 7 000 jobs were lost in full-time while 7 000 jobs were gained in part-time jobs).

Year-on-year the industry decreased by 102 000 jobs compared with same quarter of the previous year (i.e. Q4:2021).








The total number of persons employed increased by 48 000 from **9 920 000** in Q3:2022 to **9 968 000** in Q4:2022.

Year-on-year total employment decreased by 94 000 compared with same quarter of the previous year (i.e. Q4:2021).




















Gross earnings increased by R67,8 billion (or 8,5%) in the fourth quarter of 2022 compared to Q3:2022. Increases in gross earnings were due to increases in bonus payments by R44,2 billion, followed by basic salary/wages by R22,8 billion and overtime payments by R854,0 million.

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by **R39,2** billion (or **4,7%**). Increases were due to basic salary payments made by **R31,9** billion, bonus payments by **R6,1** billion and overtime payments by **R1,2** billion.



There was a quarterly increase of **8,5%** in gross earnings in the fourth quarter of 2022 compared to Q3:2022. Year-on-year earnings increased by **4,7%** in the fourth quarter of 2022 compared with same quarter of the previous year.

The total gross earnings paid to employees increased by **R67,8** billion from **R798,7** billion in Q3:2022 to **R866,6** billion in Q4:2022.

Year-on-year gross earnings increased by R39,2 billion compared with the same quarter of the previous year (i.e. Q4:2021)















AME including bonuses and overtime payments increased by 4,5% from R24 916 in August 2022 to R26 032 in November 2022. Year-on-year AME increased by 9,2%.









Six industries reported increases in average monthly earnings in the fourth quarter compared to Q3:2022.

Year-on-year, community industry reported the most increase of 13,8% in AME while mining industry reported the least increase of 4,3%.

Recap QES Q4:2022



Number of employees increased by 48 000 Q/Q & decreased by 94 000 Y/Y.



Gross earnings increased by **R67,8** billion Q/Q & increased by **R39,2** billion Y/Y.



Full-time jobs increased by 6 000 Q/Q & decreased by 9 000 Y/Y.



Basic salaries/wages increased by **R22,8**billion Q/Q & increased by **R31,9** billion Y/Y.



*Part-time jobs increased by 42 000 Q/Q and 85 000 Y/Y.



*Bonus payments increased by **R44,2** billion Q/Q & increased by **R6,1** billion Y/Y.



Average monthly earnings increased by **4,5%** Q/Q & increased by **9,2%** Y/Y.
