# **QES Background**

QES is an enterprise-based sample survey

QES collects information on employing businesses registered for VAT with annual turnover greater than R300 000

R300 000

Samples are drawn from private non-agricultural businesses e.g. factories, offices, stores as well as national, provincial and local government entities

Sample size of approximately 20 000 was selected

# **EMPLOYMENT RESULTS**

Number of persons employed in Q4:2020

9 640 000



There was a quarterly increase of 76 000 jobs (or 0,8% in the Q4:2020 compared with Q3:2020.



Jobs decreased by 594 000 (or -5,8%) in the reference quarter compared with the same quarter of 2019 (Q4:2019).







# **EMPLOYMENT RESULTS**

Number of persons employed Full-time: 8 610 000

Number of persons employed Part-time: 1 030 000



There was a quarterly decrease of 11 000 full-time jobs and a year-on-year decrease of 565 000 jobs.

Part-time jobs increased quarteron-quarter by 87 000 while yearon-year part-time jobs decreased by 29 000.







There was a quarterly net increase of 76 000 jobs in Q4:2020. Most job gains were reported in part-time employment with a net increase of 87 000 while full-time jobs decreased by 11 000.

All industries recorded losses in employment year-on-year (except mining which remain unchanged) with a net decrease of 594 000 in Q4:2020 compared with Q4:2019.

# The mining industry reported net decrease of 1 000 jobs in the third quarter of 2020.

Year-on-year the industry remained unchanged when comparing Q4:2019 with Q4:2020.

Mining and quarrying industry, Q3:2009 to Q4:2020












# The trade industry gained 54 000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2020 compared to Q3:2020.

Year-on-year the industry lost 153 000 jobs compared with same quarter of 2019.






The community services industry reported a net gain of 51 000 jobs in the fourth quarter compared to Q3:2020.

the previous year (i.e. Q4:2019).












# The total number of persons employed increased from 9 564 000 in Q3:2020 to 9 640 000 in Q4:2020

# Gross Earnings increased by R60,3 bn (or 8,9%) to R740,9 bn in Q4:2020

**Basic salary/wages**

Gross earnings increased by **R60,3** billion (or **8,9%**) in the fourth quarter of 2020 compared to Q3:2020. Increases in gross earnings were due to increases in both basic salaries/wages and bonuses and overtime payments by **R18,6** billion and **R41,7** billion respectively.

Year-on-year gross earnings decreased by R36,1 billion (or -4,6%). Decreases were due to basic salary payments made by R22,9 billion and bonus and overtime payments by R13,2 billion.



Quarterly and annual percentage change in gross earnings paid in the fourth quarter of 2020.










## Time series of gross earnings paid from Q3:2009 to Q4:2020















AME including bonuses and overtime payments **increased** in November 2020 to **R23 133.** This is a **2,4% increase** from **R22 588** in August 2020.

Quarter-on-quarter and year-on-year AME increased by 2,4% and 3,1% respectively.












Seven out of eight industries reported **increases** in average monthly earnings in the fourth quarter compared with Q3:2020. Six of the seven industries increased above industry average of **2,4%** quarter-on-quarter. Year-on-year the Mining industry reported increase of 8,3% in AME while the Construction industry declined by 3,0%. Only one of the eight industries declined in November 2020 compared to November 2019.

# Average monthly earnings were measured at R23 133 in the formal non-agricultural sector of the economy in August 2020.

This is a 2,4% increase when compared to August 2020, and an annual increase of 3,1%
