INTRODUCTION

Stats SA receives marriages data electronically from the Department of Home Affairs on a monthly basis. The data comprise of the demographic information of married couples and other related variables. The information is aquired in two fold. Marriages where both parties have ID numbers are captured at Home Affairs, data for each month is saved on a separate text file. This is then downloaded via FTP from the mainframe. State Information Technology Agency (SITA) also assists with writing the data on a CD in cases where we are unable to connect to the mainframe. For marriages where one or both parties do not have an ID number (this is \pm 150 forms), Home Affairs sends copies of marriage certificates.

Divorce forms together with court rolls are received monthly by mail from the 12 high courts in South Africa and satellites or family courts operating under the Northern-eastern divorce court, the Southern divorce court and Ferreirasdorp court.

This release provides 2005 information on registered marriages and granted divorces.

KEY FINDINGS

1. Marriages

1.1 Officially recorded marriages

The overall number of officially recorded marriages in South Africa in 2005 was 180 657. This represented an increase of 4 136 marriages as compared to 176 521 marriages recorded in 2004. Table 1.1 (page 14) shows that Gauteng recorded the highest number of marriages (44 831), followed by Western Cape (28 517) and KwaZulu-Natal (28 461). Northern Cape recorded the lowest number of marriages (4 653). Figure 1 (page 6) shows the crude marriage rates by province. It is observed that Western Cape recorded the highest crude marriage rate (613,8 per 100 000 of the population), followed by Northern Cape (515,7 per 100 000 of the population), Gauteng (497,1 per 100 000 of the population) and Free State (490,2 per 100 000 of the population). Limpopo recorded the lowest crude rate (186,9 per 100 000 of the population).

1.2 Officially recorded marriages by way of solemnisation

Table 1.1 shows that a considerable number (93 440) of marriages were solemnised by civil rites. This constituted over a half (51,7%) of all recorded marriages. A total of 59 032 marriages were solemnised through religious rites, which constituted 32,7% of all recorded marriages. The distribution of marriages by way of solemnisation and province, as shown graphically in figure 2 (page 7), indicates that marriages solemnised by civil rites were most common in all provinces except in KwaZulu-Natal and Western Cape, where religious marriages were more prevalent than civil marriages.

1.3 Officially recorded marriages by age and marital status

The information provided in Table 1.2 indicates that bridegrooms were, on average, older than their brides (35,9 was the average age for bridegrooms, while 31,4 was the average age for brides at the time of marriage). The overall median age at the time of marriages was 33,0 years for bridegrooms and 29,0 years for brides. Divorcees recorded the highest median age, followed by widowers and widows, for both bridegrooms and brides, respectively. It is further observed in Table 1.2 that most people who got married had never been married before, followed by those who were widowed and finally those who were divorced.

Age at first marriage is important as it influences the timing of childbearing, the number of years in which a couple is exposed to childbearing (in communities where childbearing starts with the formation of marital union) and ultimately fertility. In 2005, the median age for females marrying for the first time (spinsters) was 28,2 years, while the median age for males marrying for the first time (bachelors) was 32,0 years. Figure 3 provides information on age pattern of marriage for spinsters and bachelors. It is observed that the number of marriages was higher for spinsters than for bachelors up to age 29, after which the number was higher for bachelors. The peak number of marriages for bachelors and spinsters was at ages 30 to 34 years and 25 to 29 years, respectively.

2. Divorces

Officially recorded divorces

The total number of recorded divorces in 2005 was 32 484 (see Table 2.1). This figure was higher than the one recorded in 2004 (31 768). Gauteng recorded the highest number of divorces (12 302), followed by Western Cape (5 381) and KwaZulu-Natal (3 960). Northern Cape recorded the lowest number of divorces (520). The distribution of divorces by population group indicates that white population group recorded the highest number of divorces (11 582), followed by African (8 672), coloured (3 568) and Indian/Asian (1 635) population groups. The number of divorces in which the population group of individuals involved was not specified was 6 489.

Overall, the modified divorce rate for 2005 was 528,2 per 100 000 married couples. Figure 4 shows that Gauteng recorded the highest modified divorce rate (943,5 per 100 000 married couples), followed by Western Cape (763,8 per 100 000 married couples). The lowest rates (less than 300 divorces per 100 000 married couples) were observed in Mpumalanga (297,3), Eastern Cape (211,7) and Limpopo (132,1). The distribution of divorces by population group indicates that white population group recorded the highest modified divorce rate (1 156,9 per 100 000 married couples), followed by Indian/Asian (672,5 per 100 000 married couples) and coloured (633,2 per 100 000 married couples) population groups. African population group recorded the lowest modified divorce rate (203,7 per 100 000 married couples).

2.2 Divorce by way of solemnisation, population group and province

In Table 2.2.1, it is observed that 23 898 (74,0%) divorces were among couples whose marriages were solemnised through civil rites, while 5 907 (18,0%) divorces were among those whose marriages were solemnised through religious rites. The way of solemnisation for 2 679 (8,0%) divorces was not specified. The highest percentage of divorces among marriages solemnised under civil rights was observed in Gauteng (33,5%), followed by Western Cape (18,5%) and KwaZulu Natal (13,1%), while the lowest percentage was observed in Northern Cape (1,7%). Detailed information on divorces by way of solemnisation, population group and province is shown in Tables 2.2.2 to 2.2.7. Figure 5 shows that, for all population groups, the majority of divorces occurred among couples whose marriages were solemnised through civil rites, although the extent differed by population group.

2.3 Divorce by age and population group

Figure 6 and figure 7 show the number of divorces by age and population group for males and females, respectively. It is observed that, in both cases (males and females), the age pattern of divorce by sex and population group is largely the same. Furthermore, it is observed that divorces occurred mostly around ages 30 to 44 years, for all population groups. The peak age of divorce for white and African males was 35 to 39 years and 40 to 44 years, respectively. For females, the peak age was 30 to 34 years for all population groups, except for African population group for which the peak age was 35 to 39 years. The number of divorces generally increased with age, reached the peak ages, and then declined steadily.

2.4 Divorce by duration of marriage and population group

Figure 8 shows that the distribution of divorces by duration of marriage at the time of divorce was basically the same for all population groups, although the actual number of divorces differed by population group (the highest and the lowest figures were observed among white and 'mixed' population groups, respectively). The distribution of divorces was skewed towards earlier ages of marriage, with the highest number of divorces being observed for people who had been married for 5 to 9 years. For marriages that lasted for 10 years or above, the number of divorces decreased as the duration of marriages increased, for all population groups. Divorces were particularly fewer among those who had been married for at least 35 years.

Tables 2.3.1 and 2.4.1 provide information on the distribution of divorces by duration of marriage and age of husband and age of wife, respectively. From these Tables, it is observed that, for both males and females, the highest number of divorces was recorded at ages 35 to 39 years. With regard to divorces recorded for those whose marriages had lasted for 5 to 9 years, the highest number of divorces was observed at ages 30 to 34, for both husbands and their wifes. Detailed data on divorces by duration of marriage and age of husband and age of wife for each population group are given in Tables 2.3.2 to 2.3.7 and Tables 2.4.2 to 2.4.7, respectively.

2.5 Divorce and minor children involved

In 2005, a total of 32 394 minor children were involved in divorce. This figure was higher than the one observed in 2004 (29 597). Figure 9 shows that white population group recorded the highest number (10 278) of minor children involved, followed by African (9 609), coloured (4 308), Indian/Asian (1 699) and 'mixed' (432). The number of minor children whose parents' population group was not specified was 6 068. Table 2.5.1 shows that the number of minor children involved decreased as duration of marriage increased. Detailed data on divorces by number of minor children involved and population group are given in Tables 2.5.2 to 2.5.7.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Collection and compilation of data on marriages

Marriage officers obtain data on marriages from the marriage certificates that are submitted to the Department of Home Affairs. Most often magistrates, justices of peace, commissioners and ministers of religion serve as marriage officers, although other public service employees may also be designated to serve in such capacities. Marriages solemnised in courts are classed under civil marriages and are recorded by the Department of Home Affairs within three days of solemnisation of any marriage.

However, as of the 01 June 1996 no magistrate or designated persons from the Department of Justice solemnised marriages. The Department of Home Affairs now conducts the solemnisation of marriages. Data capture of the marriage details is subsequently carried out at the Department of Home Affairs. Details of the bride and bridegroom are recorded together with the religious denomination of the officiating minister. At the coding of data stage, codes are assigned only to the religious denominations with significant numbers of marriages.

Collection and compilation of data on divorces

Stats SA, through registrars of the twelve Supreme Courts, administers the divorce form. Data capture and editing are carried out at Stats SA. In addition to other relevant information, the divorce form seeks information on how the marriage had been solemnised. Prior to the 1998 passing of the Recognition of Customary Marriages Act 120 of 1998 the divorce form only recognised 'religious' and 'civil' as ways of solemnisation of the marriage. Undocumented cases of abandonment do not appear in the statistics nor do divorces that have been granted by religious or traditional authorities outside the civil courts.

Clarity on the choice of explanatory variables included in the report

The heterogeneity of the South African society makes it necessary to distinguish between global (national) effects and effects that apply specifically to certain population subgroups. For this reason, the divorce data is disaggregated into different relevant variables such as province, duration of marriage, marital status at time of marriage, occupation of spouse at time of divorce, population group, number of minor children, etc.

Of all the above variables, the relevance of population group is persistently questioned. The Department of Home Affairs does not collect information on this variable in the marriage statistics or in its other statistics (as at 1999). The divorce form however, still collects information on this variable for the purposes of informing policy. As coverage among Africans is still relatively low, it is necessary to keep the population variable in order to monitor the progress made in improving coverage.

There is, however, a section of the population that chooses not to be placed in any population group by not filling in the question on population group. Previously, imputation was applied to cases where population groups were omitted. This entailed using the names reported and other available characteristics to decipher the likely population group. This practice has been discontinued since the 1995 marriages and divorces report. The report carries in its summary marriages between people of different population groups and marriages where the population group is not specified, respectively categorised as mixed and unspecified.

Notes and Concepts

Clarification on the way of solemnisation of marriage

'Civil' marriages refer to all marriages solemnised in courts either by a magistrate or designated marriage officer. However, as of 01 June 1996, no magistrate or designated persons from the Department of Justice solemnised marriages. The Department of Home Affairs now conducts the solemnisation of marriages.

The category 'Religious' refers to marriages that were solemnised under Christian or Jewish and Hebrew rites. It excludes customary, traditional marriages, and certain religious rites, especially that of Islamic marriages. Once these unrecognised marriages are recognised by law and recorded then the use of the category 'religious' would be representative of the way marriages are solemnised in South Africa.

In cases where the religious denomination is not known or when the church description is vague, these are coded as 'unspecified'. In some of these cases only the name of the town or place where the marriages were registered is indicated.

Definitions

Crude Marriage Rate (CMR) is an index of marriage used to describe the incidence of marriage. It is expressed as the number of registered marriages per 100 000 population. CMR is calculated as follows:

Modified Crude Divorce Rate (d_{mar}) is an index of divorce used to indicate the divorce rate based on the number of married couples. It is expressed as the number of recorded divorces per 100 000 married couples. In intercensal years it is difficult to obtain a good estimate of the denominator. The denominator is usually obtained by either averaging the number of male and female, or by using one or the other. For the calculating of the modified crude divorce rate in this report the number of married persons who are female was used as the denominator

The modified crude divorce rate is calculated as follows:

Fig. 1: Crude marriage rates per 100 000 of the population by province, 2005




Fig. 2: Way of solemnisation of marriage by province, 2005




Fig. 3: Age at first marriage for bachelors and spinsters, 2005




Fig. 4: Modified divorce rate by province, 2005




Fig. 5: Divorce by way of solemnisation of marriage and population group, 2005




Fig. 6: Divorce by age group and population group (males), 2005






Fig. 7: Divorce by age group and population group (females), 2005









Fig. 9: Minor children involved by population group, 2005
