MORE IMMIGRANTS THAN FOR APRIL 1995

The number of immigrants recorded for April 1996 (459) is 25,4% more than the 366 immigrants recorded for the same month of 1995. However, the net result of immigration and emigration showed a loss of 472 persons for April 1996 compared with a loss of 464 persons for April 1995.

In April 1996, the number of immigrants who were economically active was 190, while the number of economically active emigrants was nearly three times larger, 484. The net loss of persons in professional, semi-professional and technical occupations was 103 persons during April 1996 compared with a loss of 100 persons during the same month of 1995.

During April 1996 the number of emigrants (931) who left the country was nearly twice as many as the number of immigrants (459). The most popular destinations of these emigrants during April 1996 were the UK (272), Australia (163), the USA (73) and New Zealand and Canada (72 each).

The number of overseas visitors (89 845) to South Africa increased by 5,1% during April 1996 compared with April 1995. Of these visitors 71,4% came on holiday, 16,7% for business purposes, 4,3% for work and 1,0% for other purposes, while 6,6% were in transit.

The number of South African residents who temporarily went abroad during April 1996 increased by 9,1% compared with April 1995.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The CSS published complete emigration data up to and including December 1992. Since basic information on emigration was not available thereafter, it was not possible to publish data on emigration on a monthly basis for the period January 1993 to October 1993.

However, as from 26 October 1993 the Department of Home Affairs implemented a system according to which South African residents departing for overseas from Johannesburg, Cape Town and Durban International Airports complete departure forms. This system was implemented at these three airports only, as approximately 97% of the emigrants left the country through these three ports.

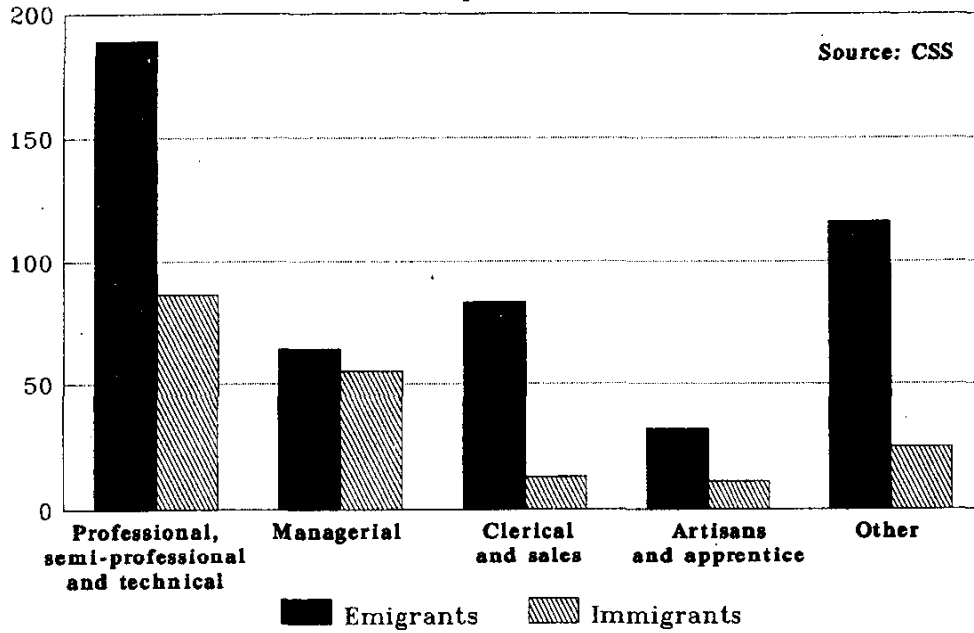
This system again made it possible to obtain and process information on South African tourists and emigrants leaving the country through these three ports as from November 1993.

The category "visitors from overseas" does not include visitors from Africa and from "unspecified" countries.

Migration by occupation

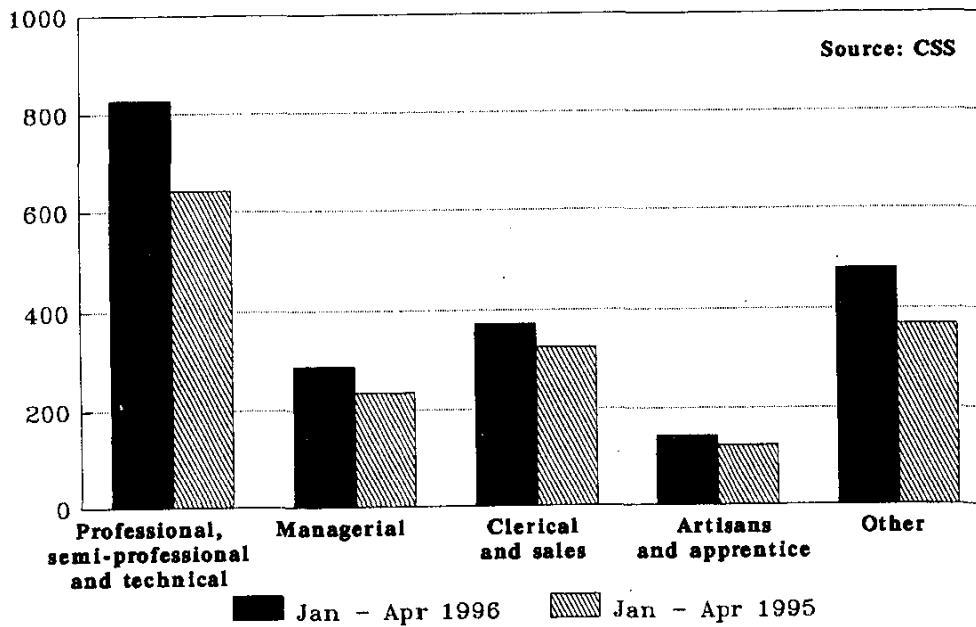
Economically active

April 1996

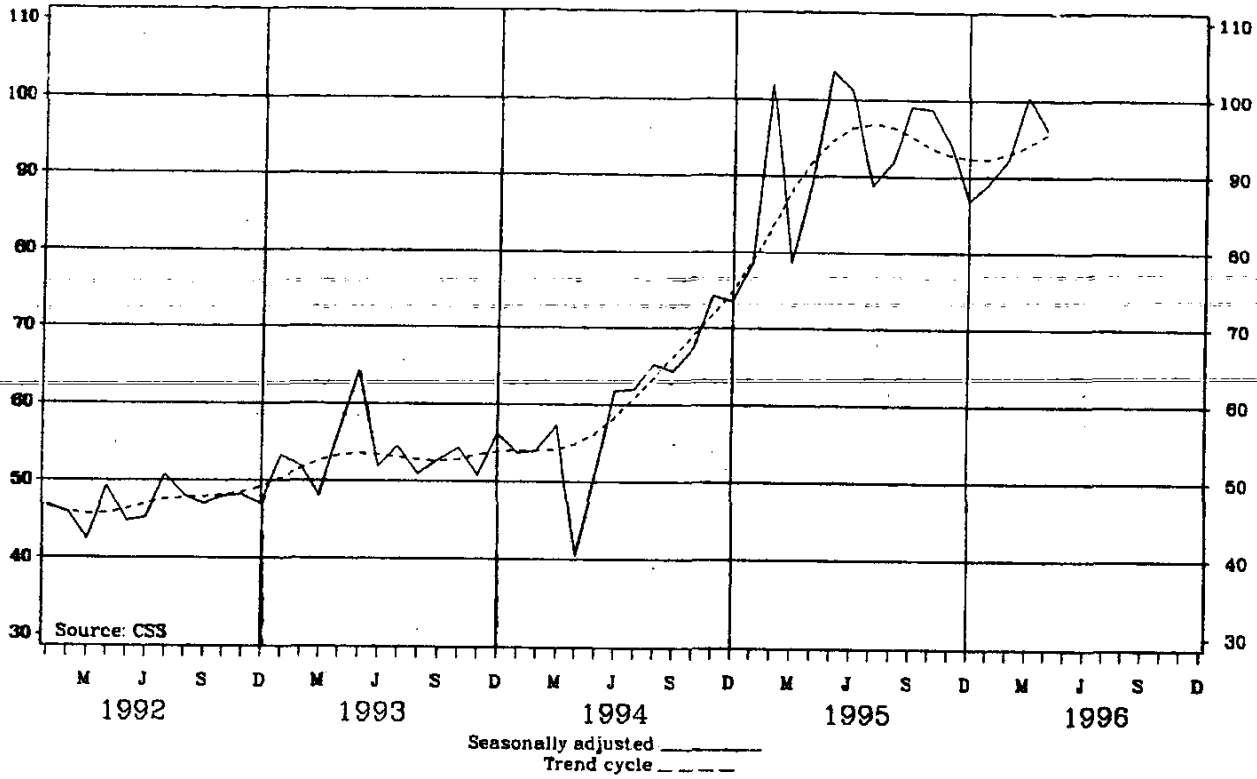


Emigrants by occupation

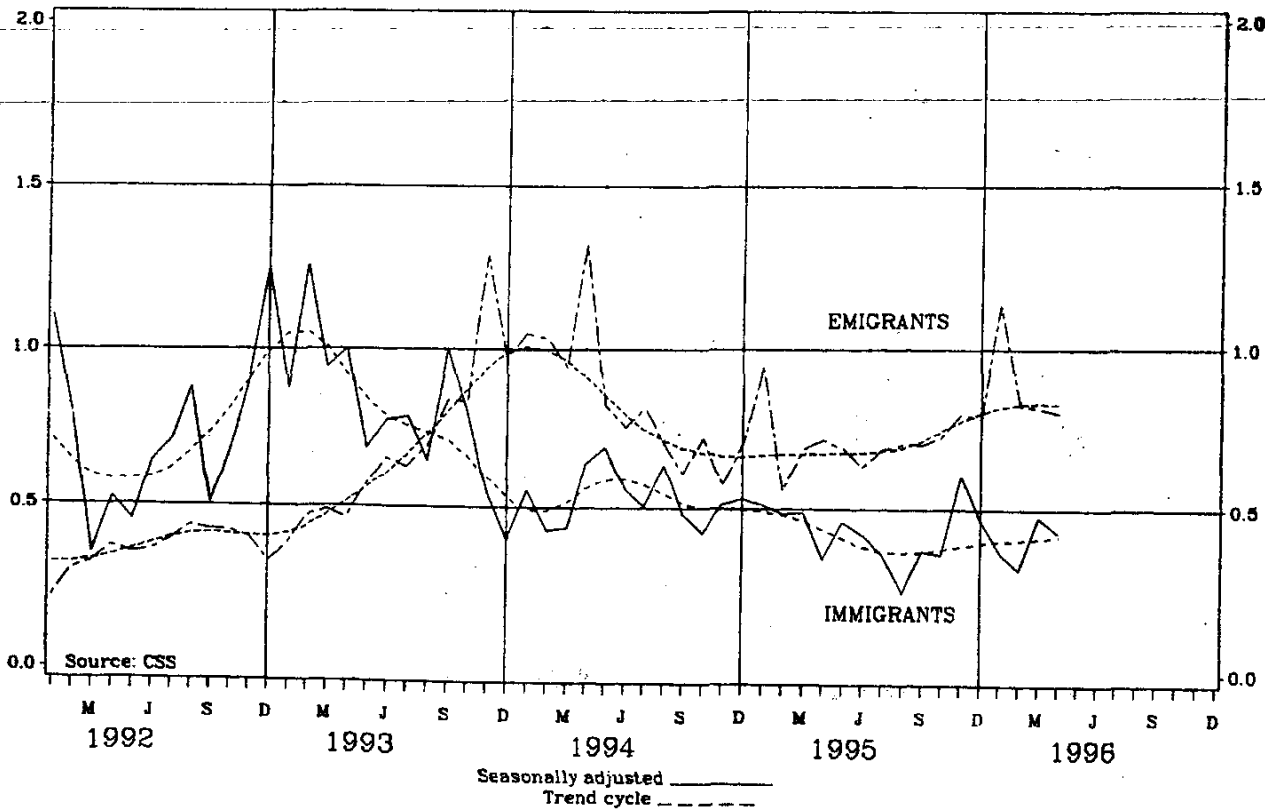

MEER IMMIGRANTE AS VIR APRIL 1995

Die getal immigrante (459) aangeteken vir April 1996 is 25,4% meer as die 366 immigrante aangeteken vir dieselfde maand van 1995. Die netto resultaat van immigrasie en emigrasie toon egter 'n verlies van 472 persone vir April 1996 teenoor 'n verlies van 464 persone vir April 1995.

In April 1996 was die getal immigrante wat ekonomies bedrywig was 190, terwyl die getal ekonomies bedrywige emigrante bykans drie keer groter was; 484. Die netto verlies van persone in die professionele, semi-professionele en tegniese beroepe was 103 persone gedurende April 1996 teenoor 'n verlies van 100 persone gedurende dieselfde maand van 1995.

Gedurende April 1996 was die getal emigrante (931) wat die land verlaat het bykans twee keer meer as die getal immigrante (459). Die gewildste bestemmings van hierdie emigrante gedurende April 1996 was die VK (272), Australië (163), die VSA (73) en Nieu-Seeland en Kanada (72 elk).

Die getal oorsese besoekers (89 845) na Suid-Afrika het gedurende April 1996 met 5,1% toegeneem teenoor April 1995. Van hierdie besoekers het 71,4% met vakansie gekom, 16,7% vir besigheidsdoeleindes, 4,3% vir werk en 1,0% vir ander doeleindes, terwyl 6,6% in transitu was.

Die getal Suid-Afrikaanse inwoners wat gedurende April 1996 tydelik na die buiteland vertrek het, het met 9,1% toegeneem teenoor April 1995.
