## KEY FINDINGS

***THE NUMBER OF OVERSEAS FOREIGN TRAVELLERS VISITING SOUTH AFRICA DURING AUGUST 2002 WAS 160 938, AN INCREASE OF 18,2% AS COMPARED TO THE AUGUST 2001 FIGURE OF 136 153.***

### **Total foreign travellers: Summary**

***The total number of foreign travellers (from overseas and from the rest of Africa) visiting South Africa during August 2002 increased by 13,1% from 506 926 in August 2001 to 573 412 in August 2002.***

The total number of foreign travellers who visited South Africa from mainland Africa, overseas and unspecified countries, arriving through all ports of entry during August 2002 was 573 412. The August 2002 figure represents an increase of 13,1% as compared with the August 2001 figure of 506 926.

During August 2002, the most common mode of travel used by foreign travellers in arriving in South Africa was road, involving 395 603 (69,0%) road travellers followed by air, involving 162 915 (28,4%) air travellers. Of the total number of foreign travellers arriving by air, 140 499 (86,2%) arrived through Johannesburg International Airport while 20 584 (12,6%) arrived through Cape Town International Airport, 888 (0,5%) arrived through Durban International Airport and the rest, 944 (0,6%), arrived through other airports.

In departing from South Africa, the most common mode of travel used by foreign travellers was road, involving 343 996 (68,6%) road travellers followed by air, involving 154 802 (30,9%) air travellers. Of the total number of foreign travellers departing by air, 131 624 (85,0%) departed from Johannesburg International Airport, 21 212 (13,7%) departed from Cape Town International Airport, 825 (0,5%) used Durban International Airport and the rest, 1 141 (0,7%), departed through other airports. Figure 1 shows the breakdown of air arrivals and departures according to the airport used.

### **Ports of entry and mode of travel used by overseas travellers and travellers from mainland Africa**

#### **Overseas travellers**

***Of the total overseas air arrivals during August 2002, 111 314 (84,4%) arrived through Johannesburg International Airport.***

During August 2002, 160 938 overseas travellers visited South Africa. The August 2002 figure represents an increase of 18,2% over the August 2001 figure of 136 153. The figures show that for August 2002, there were 131 823 air arrivals from overseas, which accounts for 81,9% of all overseas arrivals. Of these overseas air arrivals, 111 314 (84,4%) arrived through Johannesburg International Airport; 19 270 (14,6%) arrived through Cape Town International Airport; 743 (0,6%) arrived through Durban International Airport and the rest, 496 (0,4%), arrived through other airports.

The number of overseas travellers arriving by road during August 2002 was 28 126 (17,5%). The number arriving by rail, sea and unspecified mode of travel was 989 (0,6%).

#### **Travellers from mainland Africa**

***A total of 366 954 (92,3%) travellers arrived from mainland Africa by road and a further 30 159 (7,6%) arrived by air. Of these air arrivals, 28 329 (93,9%) arrived through Johannesburg International Airport.***

The total number of travellers who arrived in South Africa from mainland Africa during August 2002 was 397 718. Compared to the August 2001 figure of 357 583, this represents an increase of 11,2%. Of these travellers from mainland Africa, the number arriving by road was 366 954 (92,3%).

For the same month, there were 30 159 (7,6%) air arrivals from mainland Africa. Of these air arrivals, 28 329 (93,9%) arrived through Johannesburg International Airport, 1 260 (4,2%) arrived through Cape Town International Airport, 135 (0,4%) arrived through Durban International Airport while the rest, 435 (1,4%), arrived through other airports. The number of travellers from mainland Africa arriving by rail, sea and unspecified mode of travel was 605 (0,2%).

### **Purpose of visit as stated by overseas travellers and travellers from mainland Africa**

#### **Overseas travellers**

*In August 2002, 133 774 (83,1%) overseas travellers came to South Africa for holidays.*

Of the 160 938 overseas travellers visiting South Africa during August 2002, 133 774 (83,1%) stated that they were in South Africa for holidays while 17 425 (10,8%) stated that they were on a business trip. Overseas travellers on transit in South Africa numbered 5 309 (3,3%), those visiting for the purpose of work (including contract work) numbered 3 353 (2,1%) and those visiting for the purpose of study numbered 1 012 (0,6%).

#### **Travellers from mainland Africa**

*In August 2002, 352 490 (88,6%) travellers from mainland Africa came to South Africa for holidays.*

Of the 397 718 travellers from mainland Africa visiting South Africa during August 2002, 352 490 (88,6%) stated that they were in South Africa for holidays while 25 223 (6,3%) stated that they were on a business trip. Those visiting for the purpose of work (including contract work) numbered 7 376 (1,9%), transit visitors numbered 6 968 (1,8%) and those visiting for the purpose of study numbered 5 270 (1,3%).

### **Duration of stay as stated by overseas travellers and travellers from mainland Africa**

#### **Overseas travellers and travellers from mainland Africa**

*In August 2002, of the 160 938 overseas travellers visiting South Africa 68 113 (42,3%) stated that they intended to stay in South Africa for 271 to 365 days.*

In August 2002, 68 113 (42,3%) overseas travellers stated that they intended to stay in South Africa for 271 to 365 days and 32 599 (20,3%) stated that they intended to stay for 91 to 180 days. Of the 397 718 travellers from mainland Africa, 106 033 (26,7%) stated that they intended to stay in South Africa for 91 to 180 days and 65 622 (14,5%) stated that they intended to stay for 32 to 90 days.

### **Leading source countries of overseas travellers and travellers from mainland Africa**

#### **Overseas travellers**

*In August 2002, the leading source country of overseas arrivals was the UK, 31 969 (19,9%) followed by the USA, 20 071 (12,5%) and Germany, 16 841 (10,5%)*

During August 2002, the number of travellers from the UK visiting South Africa was 31 969 (19,9%), making it the leading country of origin of overseas travellers. This was followed by travellers from the USA, 20 071 (12,5%). The other main countries of origin of overseas travellers were: Germany, 16 841 (10,5%); Italy, 10 347 (6,4%); France, 10 288 (6,4%); the Netherlands, 8 023 (5,0%); Australia, 6 359 (4,0%) and Spain, 5 070 (3,2%). Upon comparing the figures for August 2002 with those of August 2001, the highest increase in the number of arrivals from these leading source countries was for Spain, (73,0% up from 2 931), as shown in Figure 2. The main stated purpose of visit for travellers coming from these leading source countries was holidays, followed by business.

#### **Travellers from mainland Africa**

*The leading source country of travellers from mainland Africa in August 2002 was Lesotho, 89 270 (22,4%).*

During August 2002, the top eight countries in mainland Africa from which travellers arriving in South Africa came, were: Lesotho, 89 270 (22,4%); Swaziland, 75 182 (18,9%); Botswana, 70 713 (17,8%); Zimbabwe, 55 137 (13,9%); Mozambique, 50 864 (12,8%); Namibia, 22 092 (5,6%); Zambia, 10 978 (2,8%) and Malawi, 8 802 (2,2%). When comparing arrival figures from mainland Africa, for 2001 and 2002, there was an increase in the number of travellers arriving from Zambia, (28,6% up from 8 535) and Malawi, (24,6% up from 40 826) as shown in Figure 3.

### **Departing South African residents**

#### **South African residents: Purpose of travel**

*During August 2002, South African residents travelled within mainland Africa more for business than for holidays (63,9% as opposed to 33,1%) and travelled overseas more for holidays than business (68,4% as opposed to 26,0%).*

During August 2002, the total number of South African residents who departed 'temporarily' (through all ports of exit) was 332 626, an increase of 2,0% compared to the number of South African residents who departed temporarily during the same month in 2001. Of these departing South African residents, the number who travelled by air was 109 925 (33,0%). Of those who travelled by air and left through the three international airports of Johannesburg, Cape Town and Durban, 48 331 (44,0%) filled in departure forms. This low figure reflects the inadequate enforcement of the completion of these forms. From the completed August 2002 departure forms, one can see that, on the whole, South African residents travelled within mainland Africa more for business than for holidays (63,9% as opposed to 33,1%) and travelled overseas more for holidays than business (68,4% as opposed to 26,0%).

#### **South African residents: Destination countries**

*The two leading destinations for South African residents for August 2002 were the UK, 11 576 (24,0%) and the USA, 3 403 (7,0%).*

The predominant mode of travel used by South African residents departing temporarily from South Africa in August 2002 was road, 221 981 (66,7%) followed by air 109 925 (33,0%).

For South African residents who departed temporarily in August 2002 using the three international airports as ports of exit, the leading countries of destination were the UK, 11 576 (24,0%); the USA, 3 403 (7,0%); Namibia, 2 343 (4,8%); Germany, 1 697 (3,5%); Australia, 1 494 (3,1%); Mauritius, 1 379 (2,9%); Mozambique, 1 200 (2,5%) and Zambia, 1 073 (1,8%). When compared to August 2001, the August 2002 figures are lower for all these leading destination countries, as shown in Figure 4.

### **Returning South African residents**

The number of returning South African residents in August 2002 was 317 964, a decrease of 2,0% compared to those returning during August 2001. The predominant mode of travel used by South African residents in returning to South Africa was road, 219 035 (68,9%) followed by air 98 288 (30,9%).

Of the South African residents returning by air, 81 332 (82,7%) used Johannesburg International Airport as port of re-entry while 13 447 (13,7%) used Cape Town International Airport as port of re-entry. For the same month in 2002, the number of South African residents returning through Durban International Airport was 1 028 (1,0%) and through other airports 2 481 (2,5%).

### **Documented immigration and self-declared emigration**

*The five leading sources of documented immigrants to South Africa in August 2002 were: the UK, 57 (10,7%); India, 48 (9,0%); Nigeria, 45 (8,4%); China, 41 (7,7%); and Zimbabwe, 38 (7,1%). The five leading destination countries for self-declared emigrants during August 2002 were: the UK, 194 (29,5%); the USA, 76 (11,6%); Australia, 59 (9,0%); New Zealand, 56 (8,5%) and Canada, 31 (4,7%).*

For the purpose of clarification, in the migration statistics published here, the emigration status reported refers to self-declared status. South Africans who leave permanently under the pretext of temporary visits will not appear as emigrants in the emigration statistics collected. Similarly, as per definition, 'undocumented immigrants' will not appear in the statistics collected. It is against this background that we report the migration statistics for August 2002.

The total number of self-declared emigrants departing through the three international airports was 657 in August 2002. For documented immigrants into South Africa, the total number approved as immigrants (either before or after arrival) was 533 for August 2002.

In August 2002, the leading source countries of documented immigrants were: the UK, 57 (10,7%); India, 48 (9,0%); Nigeria, 45 (8,4%); China, 41 (7,7%); and Zimbabwe, 38 (7,1%). The five leading destination countries for self-declared emigrants during August 2002 were: the UK, 194 (29,5%); the USA, 76 (11,6%); Australia, 59 (9,0%); New Zealand, 56 (8,5%) and Canada, 31 (4,7%) as shown in Figure 5.

**Historical trends in tourism, immigration and self-declared emigration**

It should be borne in mind that there is often quite a substantial month to month variation in tourism and migration figures, and one needs to look at a longer period of several months to be able to detect any trends and patterns. The trend regarding the number of overseas travellers arriving in South Africa since 1998 is shown in Figure 6. Although the figure shows evidence of seasonal fluctuations, the level of overseas tourism over the period has shown an upward trend. The historical trends in the number of immigrants and self-declared emigrants are shown in Figure 7. The Figure shows that since 1998, the number of documented immigrants has remained less than the number of self-declared emigrants. The gap between the two is slowly closing down during 2002.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

### Source of data and background

Legal movements across South African borders as well as legal immigration into South Africa fall under the jurisdiction of the Department of Home Affairs (DHA). Information on tourism and documented immigration are obtained from all ports of entry while the data on self-declared emigration statistics are obtained from only the three international airports of Johannesburg, Cape Town and Durban. Information on arrivals into and departures from South Africa are captured by DHA and loaded onto the mainframe at Bureau Nucleus. Stats SA accesses this data remotely, which is then used as part of the input data for this report. Information on emigration from South Africa and reason for temporary departure of South African residents is obtained from departure forms. The forms are sent to Stats SA on a weekly basis for data capture and processing. Lastly, information on legal immigrants to South Africa is sent to Stats SA on computer printout from DHA. The information on the printout is coded and captured by clerical staff at Stats SA.

Stats SA published complete emigration data up to and including December 1992. Since basic information on emigration was not available thereafter, it was not possible to publish data on emigration on a monthly basis for the period August 1993 to December 1993. However, as from 26 December 1993, the Department of Home Affairs implemented a system according to which South African residents departing for overseas from Johannesburg, Cape Town and Durban International Airports complete departure forms. The system was implemented at these three airports only since approximately 97% of the emigrants left the country through these three ports. This system again made it possible to obtain and process information on South African tourists and emigrants leaving the country through these three ports as from December 1993.

### Clarification of terms used in the tables

For foreign travellers, the category 'overseas total' excludes travellers from mainland Africa and from 'unspecified' countries.

### Meanings of symbols used in the tables

- = nil

? = unspecified

### Glossary of some terms used in tourism statistics

**Tourism** comprises the activities of persons travelling to and staying in places outside their usual environment for not more than one consecutive year for leisure, business and other purposes. The usual environment of a person consists of a certain area around his/her place of residence plus all other places s/he frequently visits.

A **Tourist** (overnight visitor) is a visitor who stays at least one night in collective or private accommodation in the place visited. An **international tourist** is an international visitor who stays at least one night in collective or private accommodation in the country visited. A **domestic tourist** refers to a domestic visitor who stays at least one night in collective or private accommodation in the place visited.

**Traveller** is any person on a trip between two or more localities. An **international traveller** refers to any person on a trip between two or more localities in different countries. A **domestic traveller** refers to any person on a trip between two or more localities in his/her country of residence.

**Visitor** refers to any person travelling to a place other than that of his/her usual environment for less than 12 consecutive months and whose main purpose of trip is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited.

An **international visitor** is any person travelling to a country other than the one in which he/she has his/her usual residence, but outside his/her usual environment, for less than 12 consecutive months and whose main purpose of trip is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited.

**Domestic visitor** refers to any person residing in a country, who travels to a place within that country other than the one in which s/he has his/her usual environment, for less than 12 consecutive months and whose main purpose of trip is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited.
