## 1. Introduction

### 1.1 Sources of data

Legal movements across South African borders as well as legal immigration into South Africa fall under the jurisdiction of the Department of Home Affairs (DHA). Information on tourism and documented immigration are obtained from all ports of entry while the data on self-declared emigration statistics are obtained from only the three international airports of Johannesburg, Cape Town and Durban. Information on arrivals into and departures from South Africa are captured by DHA and loaded onto the mainframe at Bureau Nucleus. Stats SA accesses this data remotely, which is then used as part of the input data for this report. Information on emigration from South Africa and reason for temporary departure of South African residents is obtained from departure forms from the three international airports. The forms are sent to Stats SA on a weekly basis for data capture and processing. Lastly, information on legal immigrants to South Africa is sent to Stats SA on computer printout from DHA. The information on the printout is coded and captured by clerical staff at Stats SA.

Stats SA published complete emigration data up to and including February 1992. Since basic information on emigration was not available thereafter, it was not possible to publish data on emigration on a monthly basis for the period July 1993 to December 1993. However, as from 26 February 1993, the Department of Home Affairs implemented a system according to which South African residents departing for overseas from Johannesburg, Cape Town and Durban International Airports complete departure forms. The system was implemented at these three airports only since approximately 97% of the emigrants left the country through these three ports. This system again made it possible to obtain and process information on South African tourists and emigrants leaving the country through these three ports as from February 1993.

### 1.2 Glossary of terms

**Key terms used in this release are defined as follows:**

**Tourism** comprises the activities of persons travelling to and staying in places outside their usual environment for not more than one consecutive year for leisure, business and other purposes. The usual environment of a person consists of a certain area around his/her place of residence plus all other places s/he frequently visits.

A **Tourist** (overnight visitor) is a visitor who stays at least one night in collective or private accommodation in the place visited. An **international tourist** is an international visitor who stays at least one night in collective or private accommodation in the country visited. A **domestic tourist** refers to a domestic visitor who stays at least one night in collective or private accommodation in the place visited.

**Traveller** is any person on a trip between two or more localities. An **international traveller** refers to any person on a trip between two or more localities in different countries. A **domestic traveller** refers to any person on a trip between two or more localities in his/her country of residence.

**Visitor** refers to any person travelling to a place other than that of his/her usual environment for less than 12 consecutive months and whose main purpose of trip is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited.

**An international visitor** is any person travelling to a country other than the one in which he/she has his/her usual residence, but outside his/her usual environment, for less than 12 consecutive months and whose main purpose of trip is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited.

**Domestic visitor** refers to any person residing in a country, who travels to a place within that country other than the one in which s/he has his/her usual environment, for less than 12 consecutive months and whose main purpose of trip is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited.

**Overseas traveller** refers to a number of foreign travellers visiting South Africa, excluding travellers from mainland Africa and from 'unspecified' countries.

## 2. Key findings

### 2.1 Foreign travellers

The total number of foreign travellers who visited South Africa from mainland Africa, overseas and unspecified countries, arriving through all ports of entry during February 2003 was 535 544. The February 2003 figure represents an increase of 6,8 % as compared with the February 2002 figure of 501 387.

During February 2003, the most common mode of travel used by foreign travellers arriving in South Africa was road, involving 335 052 (62,6%) travellers, followed by air, involving 188 080 (35,1%) travellers. Of the total number of foreign travellers arriving by air, 138 944 (73,9%) arrived through Johannesburg International Airport while 47 771 (25,4%) arrived through Cape Town International Airport, 482 (0,3%) arrived through Durban International Airport and the rest, 883 (0,5%), arrived through other airports.

For the total number of foreign travellers departing, road constituted the most common mode of travel 284 193 (62,6%), then followed by air 168 471 (37,1%). Of the total number of foreign travellers departing by air, 122 538 (72,7%) departed from Johannesburg International Airport, 44 460 (26,4%) departed from Cape Town International Airport, 338 (0,2%) used Durban International Airport and the rest, 1135 (0,7%), departed through other airports.

Figure 1 shows the breakdown of air arrivals and departures according to the airport used.

## **2.2 Ports of entry and mode of travel used by overseas and mainland Africa travellers**

### **2.2.1 Overseas travellers**

During February 2003, 184 114 overseas travellers visited South Africa. The February 2003 figure represents an increase of 11,8% over the February 2002 figure of 164 721. The figures show that for February 2003, there were 161 743 air arrivals from overseas, which accounts for 87,9% of all overseas arrivals. Of these overseas air arrivals, 114 342 (70,7%) arrived through Johannesburg International Airport; 46 579 (28,8%) arrived through Cape Town International Airport; 359 (0,2%) arrived through Durban International Airport and the rest, 463 (0,3%), arrived through other airports.

The number of overseas travellers arriving by road during February 2003 was 21 996 (11,9%). The number of travellers arriving by rail, sea and unspecified mode of travel was 375 (0,2%).

### **2.2.2 Mainland Africa travellers**

The total number of travellers who arrived in South Africa from mainland Africa during February 2003 was 339 343, as compared to the February 2002 figure of 324 014, this represents an increase of 4,7%. Of these travellers from mainland Africa, the number arriving by road was 312 600 (92,1%).

For the same month, there were 25 628 (7,6%) air travellers arriving from mainland Africa. Of these air arrivals, 23 972 (93,5%) arrived through Johannesburg International Airport, 1 137 (4,4%) arrived through Cape Town International Airport, 121 (0,5%) arrived through Durban International Airport while the rest, 398 (1,6%), arrived through other airports. The number of travellers from mainland Africa arriving by rail, sea and unspecified mode of travel was 1 115 (0,3%).

## **2.3 Purpose and duration of visit**

Of the 184 114 overseas travellers visiting South Africa during February 2003, 165 881 (90,1%) stated that they were in South Africa for holidays while 11 399 (6,2%) stated that they were on a business trip. Overseas travellers on transit in South Africa were 2 791 (1,5%), those visiting for the purpose of work (including contract work) were 2 767 (1,5%) and those visiting for the purpose of study were 1 249 (0,7%).

**Mainland Africa travellers:** Of the 339 343 travellers from mainland Africa visiting South Africa during February 2003, an overwhelming majority 299 522 (88,3%) stated that they were in South Africa for holidays while 18 923 (5,6%) stated that they were on a business trip. Transit visitors were 3 954 (1,2%), those visiting for the purpose of study were 10 526 (1,8%) and those visiting for the purpose of work (including contract work) were 6 264 (1,8%).

## 2.4 Duration of stay as stated by overseas and mainland Africa travellers

**Overseas and mainland Africa travellers:** In February 2003, of the 184 114 overseas travellers visiting South Africa 85 365 (46,4%) stated that they intended to stay for 271 to 365 and 36 326 (19,7%) stated that they intended to stay for 181 to 270 days. Of the 339 343 travellers from mainland Africa, 121 400 (35,8%) stated that they intended to stay in South Africa for 91 to 180 and 41 806 (12,3%) stated that they intended to stay for 32 to 90 days.

## 2.5 Leading source countries of overseas and mainland Africa travellers

**Overseas travellers:** During February 2003, the number of travellers from the UK visiting South Africa was 55 328 (30,1%), making it the leading country of origin of overseas travellers. This was followed by travellers from Germany, 26 959 (14,6%). The other main countries of origin of overseas travellers were: the USA, 12 222 (6,6%); France 11 057 (6,0%); the Netherlands, 10 033 (5,4%); Australia, 5 847 (3,2%); Switzerland, 3 539 (1,9%) and India, 6 528 (3,5%). Upon comparing the figures for February 2003 with those of February 2002, the highest increase in the number of arrivals from these leading source countries was for India, (178,1% up from 2 347 in 2002), (Figure: 2). The main stated purpose of visit for travellers coming from these leading source countries was holidays, followed by business.

**Travellers from mainland Africa:** During February 2003, the top eight countries in mainland Africa from which travellers arriving in South Africa came, were: Lesotho, 97 955 (28,9%); Botswana, 54 965 (16,2%); Swaziland, 51 849 (15,3%); Zimbabwe, 51 023 (15,0%); Mozambique, 42 077 (12,4%); Namibia, 14 123 (4,2%); Zambia, 8 552 (2,5%) and Malawi, 6 813 (2,0%). When comparing arrival figures from mainland Africa, for 2002 and 2003, there was an increase in the number of travellers arriving from Lesotho, (12,1% up from 87 406 in 2002) and Zimbabwe, (10,2% up from 46 292 in 2002) (Figure: 3).

## 2.6 Departing South African residents

### 2.6.1 Purpose of travel

During February 2003, the total number of South African residents who departed 'temporarily' (through all ports of exit) was 246 494, an increase of 0,7% compared to the number of South African residents who departed temporarily during the same month in 2002. Of these departing South African residents, the number who travelled by air was 87 519 (33,5%). Of those who travelled by air and left through the three international airports of Johannesburg, Cape Town and Durban, 57 226 (65,4%) filled in departure forms. From the completed February 2003 departure forms, one can see that, on the whole, South African residents travelled within mainland Africa more for business than for holidays (71,5% versus 25,5%) and travelled overseas more for holidays than business (57,5% versus 37,0%).

Of all South Africans who left the country through the three international airports, 57 226 (65,4%) completed departure forms. Therefore, information relating to emigration that is published in this release will concern only 57 226 (65,4%)

of those who departed by air. Data from departure forms has limitations that are caused by poor completion of departure forms at the international airports.

### **2.6.2 Destination countries**

The predominant mode of travel used by South African residents departing temporarily from South Africa in February 2003 was road, 158 141 (64,2%) followed by air 87 519 (35,5%).

In February 2002, the UK was the leading countries of destination at 12 279 (21,5%); followed by the USA, 3 193 (5,6%); Australia, 2 696 (4,7%); Namibia, 2 924 (5,1%); Mozambique, 1 625 (2,8%); Germany, 1 587 (2,8%); Botswana, 1 522 (2,7%) and Mauritius, 1 479 (2,6%). Among these leading destination countries, Australia showed a significant decrease in the number of South African residents visiting during February 2003 as compared to February 2002, (11,1% down from 3 031), (Figure: 4).

### **2.7 Returning South African residents**

The number of returning South African residents in February 2003 was 249 676, an increase of 1,6% compared to those returning during February 2002. The predominant mode of travel used by South African residents in returning to South Africa was road, 164 043 (65,7%) followed by air 85 027 (34,1%).

Of the South African residents returning by air, 73 504 (86,4%) used Johannesburg International Airport as port of re-entry while 8 207 (9,7%) used Cape Town International Airport as port of re-entry. For the same month in 2003, the number of South African residents returning through Durban International Airport was 1 311 (1,5%) and through other airports 2 005 (2,4%).

## **2.8 Migration**

### **2.8.1 Documented immigration and self-declared emigration**

For the purpose of clarification, in the migration statistics published here, the emigration status reported refers to self-declared status. South Africans who leave permanently under the pretext of temporary visits will not appear as emigrants in the emigration statistics collected. Similarly, as per definition, 'undocumented immigrants' will not appear in the statistics collected. It is against this background that we report the migration statistics for February 2003.

The total number of self-declared emigrants who completed the departure forms at the three international airports in February 2003 was 1 177. For documented immigrants into South Africa, the total number approved as immigrants (either before or after arrival) was 868 for February 2003.

In February 2003, the leading source countries of documented immigrants were: Nigeria, 108 (12,4%); the UK, 97 (11,2%); Pakistan, 67 (7,7%); Zimbabwe, 66 (7,6%); and China, 51 (5,9%). The five leading destination countries for self-

declared emigrants during February 2003 were: the UK, 418 (35,5%); Australia, 162 (13,8%); the USA, 109 (9,3%); New Zealand, 89 (7,6%) and Namibia, 51 (4,3%), (Figure: 5).

### **2.8.2 Historical trends in tourism, immigration and self-declared emigration**

It should be borne in mind that there is often quite a substantial month to month variation in tourism and migration figures, and one needs to look at a longer period of several months to be able to detect any trends and patterns. The trend regarding the number of overseas travellers arriving in South Africa since 1999 is shown in Figure 6. Although the figure shows evidence of seasonal fluctuations, the level of overseas tourism over the period has shown an upward trend. The historical trends in the number of immigrants and self-declared emigrants are shown in Figure 7. The Figure shows that since 1999, the number of documented immigrants has remained less than the number of self-declared emigrants. However, the gap between the two trends is slowly closing down during the first quarter of 2003, as can be seen from the Figure.
