KEY FINDINGS

Note: South African departures and arrivals are no longer required to have passport barcodes scanned at the ports of entry and exit; therefore, statistics on their departure and arrival are no longer available. Moreover those departing through the three international airports are no longer required to complete departure forms. This is due to the implementation of the Immigration Act, 2002 (Act No. 13 of 2002) by the Department of Home Affairs as from April 2003.

The release provides information on documented immigrants and travellers. It is important to note that travellers will include (a) same day visitors and tourists of which some might be in transit; and (b)other travellers such as migrants, workers for other countries paid in South Africa, diplomats and so forth.

1. Foreign travellers

The total number of foreign travellers who visited South Africa from mainland Africa, overseas and unspecified countries, arriving through all ports of entry during February 2005 was **566 966**. The February 2005 figure represents an increase of 4,9% as compared with the February 2004 figure of 540 635 (see Table 1.1.1).

During February 2005, the most common mode of travel used by foreign travellers arriving in South Africa was road, involving 358 934 (63,3%) travellers, followed by air, involving 192 957 (34,0%) travellers. Of the total number of foreign travellers arriving by air, 136 331 (70,7%) arrived through Johannesburg International Airport while 55 595 (28,8%) arrived through Cape Town International Airport, 328 (0,2%) arrived through Durban International Airport and the rest, 703 (0,4%), arrived through other airports (see Table 1.1.2).

Among the total number of foreign travellers departing, road travel was the most common mode of travel 315 775 (63,4%), then followed by air travel 181 260 (36,4%). Of the total number of foreign travellers departing by air, 126 278 (69,7%) departed from Johannesburg International Airport, 53 907 (29,7%) departed from Cape Town International Airport, 287 (0,2%) used Durban International Airport and the rest, 788 (0,4%), departed through other airports (see Table 1.1.2). Figure 1 shows the breakdown of air arrivals and departures according to the airport used.

2. Ports of entry and modes of travel used by overseas and mainland Africa travellers

2.1 Overseas travellers

During February 2005, **187 241** overseas travellers visited South Africa. This represents a 0,7% increase in the volume of travellers in February 2004 when there were 185 861 overseas travellers.

In February 2005, there were 163 900 air arrivals from overseas, which accounts for 87,5% of all overseas arrivals. Of these overseas air arrivals, 109 597 (66,9%) arrived through Johannesburg International Airport; 53 704 (32,7%) arrived through Cape Town International Airport; 187 (0,1%) arrived through Durban International Airport and the rest, 412 (0,3%), arrived through other airports.

The number of overseas travellers arriving by road during February 2005 was 21 978 (11,7%). The number of travellers arriving by rail, sea and unspecified mode of travel was 1 363 (0,7%) as shown in Table 1.2.1. A excel spread sheet on the mode of travel for all countries of origin is available on request.

2.2 Mainland Africa travellers

The total number of travellers who arrived in South Africa from mainland Africa during February 2005 was 373 157, as compared to the February 2004 figure of 341 888, this represents **an increase of 9,2%**. Of these travellers from mainland Africa, the number arriving by road was 336 398 (90,1%).

In February 2005, there were 28 359 (7,6%) air travellers arriving from mainland Africa. Of these air arrivals, 26 172 (92,3%) arrived through Johannesburg International Airport, 1 762 (6,2%) arrived through Cape Town International Airport, 141 (0,5%) arrived through Durban International Airport while the rest, 284 (1,0%), arrived through other airports. The number of travellers from mainland Africa arriving by rail, sea and unspecified mode of travel was 8 400 which constituted (2,3%) of all travellers from Mainland Africa as shown in Table 1.2.1.

3. Purpose of visit

Of the 187 241 overseas travellers visiting South Africa during February 2005, 174 222 (93,0%) stated that they were in South Africa for holidays while 6 294 (3,4%) stated that they were on business trips. Overseas travellers on transit in South Africa were 1 092 (0,6%) of the total number, those travellers arriving for the purpose of work (including contract work) were 3 991 (2,1%) and those visiting for the purpose of study were 1 494 (0,8%) as shown in Table 1.2.2. A excel spread sheet on the purpose of visit for all countries of origin is available on request.

Mainland Africa travellers: Of the 373 157 travellers from mainland Africa visiting South Africa during February 2005, an overwhelming majority 332 525 (89,1%) stated that they were in South Africa for holidays while 10 306 (2,8%) stated that they were on business trips. A further breakdown of travellers from mainland Africa is as follows: travellers in transit were 2 539 (0,7%), those visiting for the purpose of study were 13 021 (3,5%) and those travellers arriving for the purpose of work (including contract work) were 7 152 (1,9%) as shown in Table 1.2.2.

4. Duration of stay (days)

Overseas and mainland Africa travellers: In February 2005, of the 187 241 overseas travellers visiting South Africa 148 109 (79,4%) stated that they intended to stay for 271 to 365 days and 11 057 (5,9%) stated that they intended to stay for 91 to 180 days. Of the 373 157 travellers from mainland Africa, 208 115 (55,8%) stated that they intended to stay in South Africa for 91 to 180 days and 36 775 (9,9%) stated that they intended to stay for 271 to 365 days as shown in Table 1.2.3.

5. Leading source countries of overseas and mainland Africa travellers

Overseas travellers: Figure 2a indicates that during February 2005, the number of travellers from the UK visiting South Africa was 53 531 (28,7%), making it the leading country of origin of overseas travellers. This was followed by travellers from Germany, 26 983 (14,5%) and the USA, 15 345 (8,2%). Other main countries of origin of overseas travellers were: Netherlands, 10 265 (5,5%); France, 9 323 (5,0%); Australia, 5 422 (2,9%); Sweden, 4 624 (2,0%) and Switzerland, 3 748 (1,8%). Upon comparing the figures for February 2005 with those of February 2004 (see Figure 2b), the highest increase in the number of arrivals from these leading source countries was for the USA, (4,7% increase from 14 655 in 2004 to 15 345 in 2005). The main stated purpose of visit for travellers coming from these leading source countries was holidays, followed by business.

Travellers from mainland Africa: During February 2005, the top eight countries (Figure 3a) in mainland Africa from which travellers arriving in South Africa came from were: Lesotho, 117 153 (31,4%); Swaziland, 62 284 (16,7%); Botswana, 58 619 (15,7%); Zimbabwe, 56 979 (15,3%); Mozambique, 32 300 (8,7%); Namibia, 14 284 (3,8%); Zambia, 9 630 (2,6%) and Malawi, 8 047 (2,2%). When comparing arrival figures from mainland Africa, (see Figure 3b) for 2004 and 2005, there was an increase in the number of travellers arriving from Zimbabwe, (33,3% increase from 42 741 in 2004 to 56 979 in 2005).

6. Migration

6.1 Documented immigration

Note: For the purpose of clarification, as per definition, 'undocumented immigrants' will not appear in the statistics collected. It is against this background that we report the migration statistics for February 2005.

Table 2.3 indicates that in February 2005, the leading source countries of documented immigrants were: the UK, 204 (10,0%); Pakistan 195 (9,6%); Nigeria, 172 (8,5%); Zimbabwe, 162 (8,0%) and India, 110 (5,4%).

6.2 Historical trends in travel

It should be borne in mind that there is often quite a substantial month to month variation in tourism figures, and one needs to look at a longer period of several months to be able to detect any trends and patterns. The trend regarding the number of overseas travellers arriving in South Africa since 2000 is shown in Figure 4. Although the figure shows evidence of seasonal fluctuations, the level of overseas travel over the period has shown an upward trend since 2000.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. Sources of data

Legal movements across South African borders as well as legal immigration into South Africa fall under the jurisdiction of the Department of Home Affairs (DHA). Information on tourism and documented immigration is obtained from all ports of entry. Information on arrivals into and departures from South Africa is captured by DHA and loaded onto the mainframe at State Information Technology Agency (SITA). Stats SA accesses this data remotely, which is then used as part of the input data for this report. Information on legal immigrants to South Africa is sent to Stats SA on computer printout from DHA. The information on the printout is coded and captured by clerical staff at Stats SA.

South African departures and arrivals are no longer required to have their barcodes scanned or complete departure forms at the ports of entry and exit, therefore, statistics on their departure and arrival is no longer available. This is due to the implementation of the Immigration Act, 2002 (Act No. 13 of 2002) by DHA as from June 2003.

2. Glossary of terms

Key terms used in this release are defined as follows:

Tourism comprises the activities of persons travelling to and staying in places outside their usual environment for not more than one consecutive year for leisure, business and other purposes not related to the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited. The usual environment of a person consists of a certain area around his/her place of residence plus all other places s/he frequently visits.

A tourist (overnight visitor) is a visitor who stays at least one night in collective or private accommodation in the place visited. An international tourist is an international visitor who stays at least one night in collective or private accommodation in the country visited. A domestic tourist refers to a domestic visitor who stays at least one night in collective or private accommodation in the place visited.

Traveller is any person on a trip between two or more localities. An **international traveller** refers to any person on a trip between two or more localities in different countries. A **domestic traveller** refers to any person on a trip between two or more localities in his/her country of residence.

Visitor refers to any person travelling to a place other than that of his/her usual environment for less than 12 consecutive months and whose main purpose of the trip is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited.

An **international visitor** is any person travelling to a country other than the one in which s/he has his/her usual residence, but outside his/her usual environment, for less than 12 consecutive months and whose main purpose of the trip is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited.

Domestic visitor refers to any person residing in a country, who travels to a place within that country other than the one in which s/he has his/her usual environment, for less than 12 consecutive months and whose main purpose of the trip is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited.

Overseas traveller refers to a number of foreign travellers visiting South Africa (SA), excluding travellers from mainland Africa and from 'unspecified' countries.

Foreign traveller refers to a person who resides outside SA and visits the country temporarily.

South African residents are persons residing in SA (South African citizens and persons with permanent residence) who leave the country temporarily.

Documented immigrants refer to residents of other countries who have been accepted as permanent residents in South Africa. The permanent residence status could be given either before or after arrival in South Africa.

Self-declared emigrants refer to South African residents who, at the time of departing from South Africa, state their intention to leave the country and reside permanently elsewhere.

Fig 1a: Air arrivals by port of entry, South Africa, February 2005





Fig 1b: Air departures by port of exit, South Africa, February 2005






Fig. 2b: Percentage change in number of overseas travellers arriving from leading source countries in February 2005 compared with February 2004




Fig. 3a: The number of travellers from mainland African countries arriving from leading source countries in February 2004 and February 2005




Fig. 3b: Percentage change in the number of travellers from mainland African countries arriving from leading source countries in December 2004 compared with December





Fig 4: Overseas Travellers - Arrivals Thousands
