

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED WHOLESALE TRADE SALES INCREASE AFTER LOW SALES IN MARCH 1996


The wholesale trade sales (excluding diamonds) for April 1996 amount to R17 705,5 million, which is 13,3% higher after seasonal adjustment than the relatively low sales for March 1996. The seasonally adjusted sales for the three months up to April 1996 show an increase of 5,4% compared with the preceding three months.

All nine types of businesses show increases in their seasonally adjusted sales for April 1996 compared with March 1996. The sales of wholesalers in office and shop equipment, books and stationery for April 1996 amount to R1 022,7 million, which after seasonal adjustment, is 38,5% higher than for March 1996. Due to the low seasonally adjusted sales for this type of business, for March 1996, the seasonally adjusted sales for the three months up to April 1996 is only 1,7% higher than for the preceding three months. Wholesalers in miscellaneous goods, which have the largest market share, reflect an increase of 12,5% in their seasonally adjusted sales for April 1996 compared with March 1996. The smallest increase (+0,3%) occurred in respect of wholesalers in textiles, clothing and footwear.


WHOLESALE TRADE SALES BY TYPE OF BUSINESS % change in seasonally adjusted sales

NOTES

This statistical release shows final estimates of the wholesale trade sales in the Republic of South Africa (the former TBVC states are included). The survey is conducted on a firm basis. The results of the sample survey are raised to represent the total wholesale trade sales. Both actual and seasonally adjusted values of wholesale trade sales according to type of business at current as well as constant 1990 prices are shown. The value of sales at constant 1990 prices in respect of each type of business is obtained by deflating the sales value at current prices by means of sub-indices of the production price index on base 1990=100.

Wholesale trade sales at current prices include VAT.
