
REAL WHOLESALE TRADE SALES FOR THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1997 ARE LOWER THAN LAST YEAR

The real wholesale trade sales (at constant June 1995 prices), excluding diamonds, for the three months up to March 1997 show a decrease of 4,8% compared with the corresponding period of 1996.


Six of the nine types of wholesalers (excluding diamonds) show decreases in their real sales for the first three months of 1997 compared with the corresponding period of 1996. The real sales of wholesalers in foodstuffs, beverages and tobacco decreased substantially by 16,1%. However, this decrease is mainly technical and due to the restructuring of certain companies which resulted in their wholesale trade subsidiaries becoming dormant and their activities being taken over by the parent companies in other sectors, such as manufacturing. Wholesalers in miscellaneous goods, which have the largest market share, show a decrease of 6,9% in their real sales, whereas wholesalers in machinery and equipment, which have the second largest market share, show an increase of 8,4%.

The total value of wholesale trade sales (excluding diamonds) for March 1997 amounted to R18 568,4 million, which is 6,6% higher than for March 1996. This represents a decrease of 5,3% in real terms (at constant June 1995 prices).

Jan. - Mar. 1997 v. Jan. - Mar. 1996




WHOLESALE TRADE SALES (EXCLUDING DIAMONDS)

NOTES

This statistical release shows final estimates of the wholesale trade sales in the Republic of South Africa (the former TBVC states are included). The survey is conducted on a firm basis. The results of the sample survey are raised to represent the total wholesale trade sales. Both actual and seasonally adjusted values of wholesale trade sales according to type of business at current as well as at constant June 1995 prices are shown. The value of sales at constant June 1995 prices in respect of each type of business is obtained by deflating the sales value at current prices by means of sub-indices of the production price index on base June 1995=100.

Wholesale trade sales at current prices include VAT.
