Financial statistics of universities and technikons

Co-operation between Statistics South Africa (Stats SA), the citizens of the country, the private sector and government institutions is essential for a successful statistical system. Without continued co-operation and goodwill, the timely release of relevant and reliable official statistics will not be possible.

Stats SA publishes approximately three hundred different releases each year. It is not economically viable to produce them in more than one of South Africa's eleven official languages. Since the releases are used extensively, not only locally, but also by international economic and social-scientific communities, Stats SA releases are published in English only.




TOTAL EXPENDITURE BY UNIVERSITIES AND TECHNIKONS AMOUNTED TO R17 440,1 MILLION IN 2002

Total expenditure by South African universities and technikons amounted to R17 440,1 million in the 2002 financial year (ending on 31 December 2002). This reflected an increase of 13,0% compared with the R15 427,9 million of the 2001 financial year. Universities spent R13 320,8 million (76,4%), while technikons spent R4 119,3 million (23,6%) of the total expenditure in 2002.

The largest contributor to the total expenditure of R17 440,1 million for 2002 was remuneration of employees (R8 897,5 million or 51,0% of total expenditure), followed by expenditure on other goods and services for current activities (R5 086,5 million or 29,2% of total expenditure), capital expenditure (R1 364,6 million or 7,8% of total expenditure), depreciation (R881,6 million or 5,1% of total expenditure) and maintenance (R645,4 million or 3,7% of total expenditure) (see Figure 1, p. 1 and Table 1, p. 3, columns 9 and 12).

Explanatory Notes

Introduction

1. This statistical release provides expenditure information of universities and technikons for the 2002 financial year. The financial year of universities and technikons ends on 31 December of each year.

Methodology

3. Stats SA receives financial statements of universities and technikons annually from the Department of Education. Universities and technikons keep their accounts on an accrual basis in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (GAAP), i.e. payments are recorded in the period to which the transactions relate and surpluses, deficits, assets and liabilities are carried over to the next financial year. Financial statements were received for all 35 institutions listed above. Missing or incomplete information was supplemented through telephonic liaison with the relevant universities and technikons as far as possible.

- **4.** The tables contain only the consolidated information of all the accounts and funds of the universities and technikons. Stats SA does not receive separate information for hostels and trust funds.
- 5. The expenditure on land and buildings by government departments (as a direct liability against their votes) on behalf of certain universities and technikons is not included in the tables.

Comparability with previous statistical release

6. Maintenance of buildings and structures and machinery and equipment was included in expenditure on other goods and services in the previous release. In this release it is shown as a separate expenditure item for both the 2001 and 2002 financial years.

The former ML Sultan and Natal Technikons have merged since the 2002 financial year to form the Durban Institute of Technology.

Classification

7. Economic classification

Economic classification is in general a measure of the nature and economic effect of government on the economy of a country. The layout of the economic classification (type of expenditure) in this statistical release is as follows:

Books This includes mainly library books.

Households Households may be defined as individuals or a small group of persons who share

the same living accommodation.

Machinery and equipment Machinery and equipment are divided into vehicles, computer equipment,

furniture and other machinery and equipment.

Non-residential buildings Non-residential buildings include clinics, hospitals, offices and office blocks,

warehouses, laboratories, workshops and lecture halls.

Other constructions Other constructions include sport fields, roads and fences.

Other goods and services Other goods and services include purchases of all other goods and services,

except remuneration of employees, for current activities. In accordance with the recommendations of the 1993 System of National Accounts (SNA) these kinds of expenditure exclude capital expenditure relating to office, school, and

household furniture and equipment.

Remuneration of employees Remuneration of employees primarily includes salaries, wages, service and other

bonuses, allowances (including car allowances), retirement benefits, contributions to medical, insurance and pension funds, compensation in respect

of examinations and housing subsidies.

Residential buildings Residential buildings are buildings that are used entirely or primarily as

residences and include student houses, flats, hostels and nursing homes.

Subsidies Subsidies are current unrequited payments that general government pay to

enterprises on the basis of the quantities or values of the goods and services,

which they produce, sell or import.
