


### Safeguarding every drop

Water outages across the country have focussed attention on water as a vital resource. South Africa is a semi-arid country, with only a few natural source areas for water. These areas, referred to as Strategic Water Source Areas (SWSAs), can be thought of as ecological infrastructure and are as important as built infrastructure for water such as dams.

SWSAs are areas of the country that provide large volumes of water per unit area. They provide either surface water or groundwater (or both), making them vitally important assets for ensuring water security.

The recently released discussion document, Accounts for Strategic Water Source Areas, 1990 to 2020, provides a wealth of data on South Africa's 22 SWSAs. These areas are found mainly in the eastern and south-western parts of the country, many of them located along the escarpment.




