


# Falling inside the norm: Municipal spending on employees

Employee costs take up a sizable chunk of municipal spending. Staff remuneration costs accounted for 28% of total municipal expenditure in 2022, according to recent data from Stats SA. The aggregate proportion of 28% falls within the National Treasury norm of 25%–40%.

A more nuanced picture emerges if we map all 257 municipalities. In the chart, each dot represents a municipality. The location of each municipality on the x-axis represents its share of remuneration costs to its expenditure.

West Rand District Municipality appears on the far right, recording the highest proportion. Its remuneration costs accounted for 78% of its expenditure. Rustenburg Local Municipality in North West registered the lowest reading at 12%.


## Motor trade: sedans in the driver's seat

Motorists in South Africa love their sedans. In 2018, sedans accounted for 26% of total retail sales in the motor trade industry. Hatchbacks were in second place (15%), followed by vans and trucks. Minibuses contributed 4%.

Stats SA's detailed survey on the motor trade industry also provides data on new and used vehicles. In 2018, new vehicles accounted for 59% of retail sales and used vehicles 41%.

Compare this with 2015. That year, new vehicles accounted for 62% and used vehicles 38% of total retail sales.


