
### Renewable energy investments support GDP growth in Q2: 2023

Investments in energy infrastructure were detected in the latest set of gross domestic product (GDP) figures. The demand side of the economy saw a sharp rise (of 11,0%) in capital spending on machinery & other equipment in the second quarter, which included products related to renewable energy.

This was reflected by import data, with the country recording an increase in imports of machinery & other equipment, mostly for electrical infrastructure. There were also sales of locally produced electric motors and generators.

Construction works also made a positive contribution to gross fixed capital formation, recording a rise of 0,3% in the second quarter. However, non-residential buildings, transport equipment, residential buildings and transfer costs registered declines.

## Infographic of the month

### Gender equality in local government: an update


In 2021, there were 13 492 senior-level posts across local government, with women occupying 5 312 (or 39%) of these. This is according to Stats SA's latest *Non-financial census of municipalities* report.

Each bubble on the chart represents a municipality. Its position on the x-axis represents the percentage of senior-level posts that are occupied by women. What immediately stands out is that most municipalities fall below 50%. In terms of gender representation, only 25 of the 257 municipalities meet or exceed the 50% mark.

Mangaung in Free State recorded the highest percentage, with women occupying 341 (or 95%) of 360 senior-level posts.

The size of a bubble represents the total number of senior-level posts, providing an indication of municipal size.



## Provincial snapshot



### Unemployment rate above national average in five provinces

The national official unemployment rate was 32,6% in the second quarter of 2023. This was slightly down from 32,9% in the first quarter.

Five of the nine provinces registered official unemployment rates higher than the national average. Eastern Cape recorded the highest rate (39,7%) in the second quarter, followed by Mpumalanga (38,4%).

Four provinces were below the national average, with Western Cape recording the lowest rate (20,9%).

At 53,5%, North West found itself on top of the list with the highest expanded unemployment rate.
