
Stats SA releases new provincial GDP figures

After a two-year hiatus, Stats SA has released an experimental set of provincial gross domestic product (GDP) data.

Gauteng may be the smallest of the nine provinces in terms of area size, but it has the largest economy. In 2022, the province was responsible for R33 of every R100 produced by the South African economy. The economy of Gauteng is larger than the economies of KwaZulu-Natal and Western Cape combined!

It comes as no surprise then that Gauteng is perceived as the best place to find work. Stats SA estimates that the province will receive the largest inflow of migrants in the 2021–2026 period, attracting 1,4 million individuals. Western Cape is estimated to receive the second highest number of in-migrants (0,46 million) from other provinces and from abroad.




