


Electricity industry sees highest growth in 16 years

The country experienced no load shedding in the second quarter of 2024, which helped the electricity, gas & water supply industry. It grew by 3,1% compared with the first quarter, driven by increased electricity generation and water distribution. If we ignore the topsy-turvy economic environment caused by the pandemic in 2020, the 3,1% growth rate is the highest since the third quarter of 2008.

The latest gross domestic product (GDP) data show six other industries registering positive growth in the second quarter of 2024.

On the downside, three industries were weaker. Land transport and transport support services weighed negatively on the transport industry. Agriculture reported lower production of field crops and animal products. The mining sector was pulled lower by iron ore, coal, diamonds and gold.


GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT 02: 2024

South Africa's GDP grew by **0,4%** in the second quarter of 2024
























- Real GDP was R1166 billion in O2:2024
- 2 The economy expanded by **0,4%** in Q2: 2024 compared with Q1: 2024
- 3 Seven industries grew in Q2:2024, with electricity, finance and trade recording the highest growth rates
- 4 Both agriculture and mining dragged the primary sector down in Q2:2024
- 5 All secondary sector industries grew in O2:2024
- **6 Except for transport**, all industries in the tertiary sector expanded in O2:2024
- **7** Finance is the largest industry in the South African economy, contributing 23% to total value added
- 8 Gross fixed capital formation (i.e. investments in infrastructure and other fixed assets) declined in Q2:2024. Exports were also down
- 9 Households increased spending on a range of products in Q2:2024, most notably miscellaneous goods & services and clothing





Provincial snapshot



Employment numbers fall in five provinces

Employment has taken a downward turn, according to the latest data. The number of employed declined by a net 92 000 in the second quarter of 2024 compared with the first quarter, bringing the total number of employed down to 16,65 million.

Job losses were concentrated in five provinces, with Western Cape and Mpumalanga recording the largest decreases.

Although Gauteng, Limpopo, Eastern Cape and Free State registered gains, these were not enough to offset the national decline.


