



## Investment in South Africa's school feeding scheme

You can't teach a hungry child. In 1994, the South African government established the National School Nutrition Programme (NSNP), a nationwide project that provides meals to schools in poorer communities. The aim of the programme is to ensure that learners receive adequate nutritional support, contributing to good health and improved academic performance.


Provincial government spent R299,7 billion on education in 2022/23, according to data from the latest *Financial statistics of provincial government* statistical release. The NSNP accounted for 2,8% (or R8,4 billion) of this total.

KwaZulu-Natal was the largest spender of NSNP funds, representing 22% (or R1,9 billion). Limpopo and Eastern Cape accounted for 18% each and Gauteng 12%



Major contributors to the headline rate (January 2019 to August 2024)










