# Sequencing the DNA of provincial economies

Each province has its own unique economic profile. The latest set of regional gross domestic product (GDP) figures paint a picture of what each province brings to the economic table of the country.


National agricultural production, for example, is concentrated in KwaZulu-Natal, Western Cape and Mpumalanga. Together, these three provinces account for almost 60% of national agricultural activity.

The country depends heavily on North West, Limpopo and Mpumalanga for the bulk of its mining wealth, and we can thank Gauteng, KwaZulu-Natal and Western Cape for 75% of overall manufacturing output.






