South Africa's economy weakens in the third quarter

Agriculture took the wind out of the economy's sails in the third quarter, dragging overall economic growth into negative territory. Real gross domestic product (GDP) declined by 0,3%. Agriculture contracted by 28,8%, subtracting 0,7 of a percentage point from GDP growth. Transport, trade and government also contributed to the slowdown.

On the upside, finance was the largest positive contributor. Electricity, gas & water supply; mining; construction; personal services and manufacturing were also stronger.

Construction's second straight rise of 1,1% may seem relatively small, but it's the biggest increase in two years. The industry's positive showing in the third quarter was mainly driven by construction works, with support from activities related to nonresidential buildings.





Exploring the government spending pie

The South African government spent R2,3 trillion in 2022/23, a rise of R91 billion from the previous year. The graphic shows how this money was distributed, with the size of each shape representing the expenditure per function.

What is striking is the size of public debt transactions, the biggest slice. This represents the amount of money that government spends on servicing its debt, which mainly includes interest payments. Public debt transactions accounted for R308 billion or 13,5% of total expenditure in 2022/23. In other words, for every R100 of government spending, R13,50 was directed towards managing the country's debt burden.

The second largest item was legislative services, accounting for R199 billion or 8,7% of total spending. This category covers expenditure related to the administration of parliament, the provincial legislatures and mayoral offices, as well as financial and fiscal affairs.



Provincial snapshot



Unemployment rate down in seven provinces

The unemployment rate decreased in seven of the nine provinces in the third quarter of 2024. The largest quarter-on-quarter decreases were recorded in North West (41,3% to 36,8%), Eastern Cape (41,0% to 37,2%) and Western Cape (22,2% to 19,6%).

Limpopo and KwaZulu-Natal bucked the trend, recording higher rates.

The chart shows provincial unemployment rates in the third quarter. Eastern Cape had the highest official unemployment rate, followed by North West and Mpumalanga. Western Cape and Northern Cape recorded the lowest.


